Language Arts: This class covers three main focuses in education: grammar and syntax, vocabulary, and reading comprehension. We will be utilizing both our grammar texts and our chosen literary pieces to achieve the essential learning goals for the school year. Students will challenge themselves to learn 20 vocabulary words in a three to four-week unit. Students will explore author's purpose, character development, and literary devices through our novels and short stories. Students will improve their writing by learning key concepts in grammar, as well as apply those concepts to their reading assignments. The overall goal this year is to combine Literature with Grammar to melt the two subjects in to a cohesive and beneficial course. This course is best approached by placing trust in Mrs. Conto, and keeping up with the assignments given.

essential learnings

grades

The final grade is determined by points earned on homework, essays, quizzes and tests divided by points possible.

Example: Points earned/ Points possible= Percentage

- ✓ Homework and classwork assignments are worth an average of 10-20 points each.
- ✓ Quizzes and checkpoints are worth an average of 20-30 points each.
- ✓ Tests and essays are worth an average of 50-100 points each.

LATE WORK:
