

## ELA Summer Choice Board

### Incoming Grade 5

For your summer work in ELA, select one item **from each row**. **Two assignments** must be completed and submitted to your teacher by the end of the first week of school.

You may select your own book, but the book should be at a reading level for grades 4-6. For those students who have not yet joined Google Classroom, the Class Code is **yubbcwe**.

<p><b>Row 1</b> (Select one task from this row)</p>	<p>Select a book to read at your reading level and read it. Pretend you are interviewing the main character. Write six to eight questions to ask the main character in a book. Then write a response to each question. The questions and answers should provide information that shows you have read the book.</p>	<p>Select a book to read at your reading level and read it. Create a three panel Novel Brochure. 1. The Novel Title and Author must be on the front cover. 2. The inside of the brochure must include the following subheadings: Introduction, Summary, Characters, Theme, Favorite Quotes, Analysis, and Rating. <u>Refer fo the sample format attached.</u></p>	<p>Select a book to read at your reading level and read it. Create a poster for one main character. 1. Draw the character using information from the book: the character's actions, feelings, thoughts. 2. Write at least three positive (good) character traits with an explanation to support each trait. 3. Include any negative traits with support. 4. Include additional Information. For example, their likes, dislikes, family, friends.</p>
<p><b>Row 2</b> (Select one task from this row)</p>	<p>Select a book to read at your reading level and read it. Write a new ending for the book. The new ending should be several paragraphs in length.</p>	<p>Select a book to read at your reading level and read it. Write a book report that begins with the title, author, and a brief summary. Then describe the main character(s), setting, conflict, and main events of the book.</p>	<p>Select a book to read at your reading level and read it. Create a Book in a Bag using a large paper bag. 1. On the front of the bag <b>draw</b> a scene from the book. <u>Computer images are NOT permitted.</u> 2. On the back of the bag write a one page summary of the book. 3. Inside the bag place five items that show something from the book. Each item should have an explanation card that explains why the item represents something from the book.</p>
