Beirut Victims We pray for the 200 people who died, the 8000 injured and the 200,000 homeless and all the people of Lebanon at this time.

All Masses Please arrive at the Church door off the car park and not the Union Street entrance which will be closed. Parishioners will be welcomed by a steward outside the door who will ask you for your name and contact details (for Track and Trace if necessary). He/she will direct you steadily to the second steward inside the Church porch, who will point out hand The hand sanitisers, Please take Mass sheets, newsletters and Covid 19 rules and take them away with you at the end of Mass. A third steward will guide you to your seat. **2 metre social distancing in the Church is extremely important.** Parishioners living in the same household or "social bubbling" can sit together, but single household Parishioners must sit 2 metres apart at the end of the open pews to comply with Church and Government Guidelines.

FACE COVERINGS (Masks, Scarves or Visors and a mask)

The Government has announced that face coverings are mandatory in places of worship and that it is now a legal requirement. As I'm sure you know, the thinking behind this is to reduce the chances of spreading any potential germs to other people through sneezes, etc, particularly as the daily number of new covid 9 cases seems to be rising.
