Confessions By Appointment in the Garden.

All Masses Please arrive at the Church door off the car park and not the Union Street entrance which will be closed. Parishioners will be welcomed by a steward outside the door who will ask you for your name and contact details (for Track and Trace if necessary). He/she will direct you steadily to the second steward inside the Church porch, who will point out hand the hand sanitisers, Please take Mass sheets, newsletters and Covid 19 rules and take them away with you at the end of Mass. A third steward will guide you to your seat. **2 metre social distancing in the Church is extremely important.**

Parishioners living in the same household or "social bubbling" can sit together, but single household Parishioners must sit 2 metres apart at the end of the

open pews to comply with Church and Government Guidelines. Face Coverings to be worn.

Coronavirus Update The North East is currently experiencing a surge in the numbers of Covid positive cases. Though Pocklington is not in this area, the Diocesan Care and Welfare Officer has asked that all parishioners disperse quickly after Mass and not to congregate outside chatting. In effect this would reduce the level of risk so that in the unfortunate event of the NHS asking for Track and Trace to become operative our Church has a better chance of not being closed for 14 days.

Dial-a-Mass: The Diocese of Middlesbrough, in conjunction with the Knights of Saint Columba, began Dial-a-Mass for the benefit of those who do not have access to a computer or the internet. The Mass is recorded and put on the telephone at 12:00noon each Sunday and remains available until 11:59am the following Sunday. The Mass will not go over one hour in length and tends to be around 45 minutes. Anyone who wishes to hear Mass in this way, for the cost of a local call, can access it by dialling 01642 130 120. This service has been well received and has been of particular benefit to those who feel isolated from the faith community. Additional costs for this service are covered by the Knights of Saint Columba.
