## SJV Newsletter – 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This is the craziest Lent I have encountered! However, remember that God is crazy in love with YOU! Keep Sunday holy even though you can't come to the church building. You can livestream the Mass online or read the scripture readings together as a family, <a href="http://www.usccb.org/bible/readings/032220.cfm">http://www.usccb.org/bible/readings/032220.cfm</a>, or spend some time in prayer.

Our 2<sup>nd</sup> reading from this Sunday's Mass says, "Live as children of light, for light produces every kind of goodness and righteousness and truth" (Eph 5: 8b-9). What goodness are you producing for your family, your neighbors, your friends? I see that some children are making drawings for grandparents and sending those via email or showing them through windows. You can offer a rosary or some other prayer for a relative or friend. Use your imagination to think of new and creative ways to offer goodness to others!

There are no new updates in the directives from Bishop Doherty. Just a reminder that Bishop Doherty has mandated the suspension of all public celebrations of the Mass, other liturgical services and gatherings of the faithful effective Wednesday, March 18, 2020 until further notice. The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass from March 13, 2020 continues until further notice. It is not a permanent dispensation. In this time of trial and testing, teach all of us in the Church to love one another and to be patient and kind. Help us to bring the peace of Jesus to our land and to our hearts.

We come to you with confidence, knowing that you truly are our compassionate mother, health of the sick and cause of our joy.

Shelter us under the mantle of your protection, keep us in the embrace of your arms, help us always to know the love of your Son, Jesus. Amen.
