Mary and the Holy Spirit Leading Us to Jesus!

As we are consecrating our parish to Mary this weekend (see my column in last week's bulletin), I have received a few questions about why consecration to Mary, not to Jesus? For those of us who have done the Consecration to Jesus through Mary (the well-known approach of St. Louis de Montfort), we recall that St. Louis de Montfort said that his desire was to have a direct consecration to Mary, but that in the end, he chose to call it a consecration to Jesus through Mary as the main purpose was to have Mary lead us to Jesus. You will see that the prayer of Consecration we will pray together this weekend at all Masses (including the one with Bishop Dorsonville at the 7 pm bilingual Mass (English and Spanish) is to lead all of us to Jesus! The ultimate purpose is the one we are all seeking: to be with Jesus and stay with Him forever!

Another question I received was as to why not simply pray to the Holy Spirit? This is a good question. The benefits, the fruits of our consecration to Mary depend upon the work of the Holy Spirit. Jesus told all of us that as he returned to Heaven (Ascension), He would send upon all of us His Spirit, the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is within each of us since our baptism and, even more so since our confirmation. In every sacrament the Holy Spirit is at work. So why a consecration to Mary? Mary is not only the mother of Jesus, she is also the spouse of the Holy Spirit. Mary is our privileged intercessor. We do not pray to Mary, we ask Mary to pray for us (as in the ending of the Hail Mary). Mary is so close to Jesus in Heaven, that she can call on Jesus to assist us and can also ask Jesus to send His Spirit upon us. In this way, one can say that the benefits, the fruits of our consecration to Mary depend upon the work of the Holy Spirit.

In our prayer of consecration this weekend, we will say together: "Mary, to consecrate ourselves to you, we offer you our whole being, body and soul, mind and senses, our sorrows and our joys, all that we possess. Mary, help us to persevere and grow in faith and through our actions advance the Kingdom of your Son. Mary, help us to have a heart like yours: pure in spirit, free of sin, and open to the will of God. Mary, lead us to Jesus and accept our act of consecration."

May the Holy Spirit continue to guide all our actions! May Mary continue to lead us to Jesus!
