Entering Advent Walking with Mary: Friday December 8 & Saturday December 9

In this Joyful 1st Sunday of Advent (December 2-3), we turn our attention toward Mary. With the young, pregnant Mary, we anticipate the Joy of the Birth of Baby Jesus. Advent is a time of waiting, a time of watching. Mary does not know the time nor the day when she will give birth to Baby Jesus. As Jesus tells his disciples in today's Gospel (Mark 13:33-37): "Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come...Watch, therefore: you do not know when the Lord of the house is coming...What I say to you, I say to all: Watch!" We know that in today's parable Jesus is the man traveling abroad...and no one knows when he will return. While the parable is about the Second Coming of Christ (the end of times), it also makes us reflect on the First Coming of Christ: Christmas! We know that we will celebrate Christmas on December 25, but we also know that we need to be watchful during the next few days - to be watchful so that we can be fully prepared to receive the joy of the **newborn King** in our hearts.

As we continue to celebrate these special seven months of Mary at OLHOC (ending May 20), it is fitting that in this First week of Advent, we have three opportunities to feel the presence of Mary: (1) This Tuesday, December 5, special Mass at 7 PM followed by Devotion to Immaculate Heart of Mary and contemplation of the message of Fatima (see flyer at the Helpdesk). (2) This Friday, December 8, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception—Day of Obligation with Masses at 9 AM, Noon, and 7 PM. Lastly, (3) This Saturday, December 9, Walking with Mary (traditional annual walk held in DC).

This year our celebration of the Immaculate Conception will mark the completion, for many of us, of the 33 days of Consecration to Jesus through Mary! At the end of the 7 PM Mass on Friday, December 8, we are all invited to proclaim our individual Consecration to Jesus through Mary. For those of us who will have completed the 33 days of preparatory prayers (over 100 of us signed up last month), this will be a very special moment. The words we will use will remind us that Mary will continue to lead us to her Son, Jesus, and with St. John Paul II, we can sum up this Consecration of ourselves to Jesus through Mary in two words: Totus Tuus (Totally Yours). Jesus, we become totally yours through the hands of Mary. Jesus, becoming totally attached to your mother Mary (becoming her slave), we become totally attached to you. We become your slave, too, as Mary and you are always attached to one another: Mary and you are **one!** May we all be one with Jesus and Mary!

You are all invited to join us in walking with Mary on Saturday, December 9! This has also become an annual tradition in our parish: we are joining the downtown DC walk with Mary from Sacred Heart Church in Washington DC, to the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception (see flyer for details). Last year we carpooled. This year we are going to the Sacred Heart Church in DC by bus. If you have not yet signed up, please do so at the end of the Masses this weekend. This annual walk (about 1 hour walk through the streets of Washington) is a procession to honor the Patroness Saint of the Americas, on the Saturday before her annual Feast: December 12, Our Lady of Guadalupe. On that very day, Tuesday, December 12, we will hold our traditional 5 AM Mass w/mariachis here at OLHOC.
