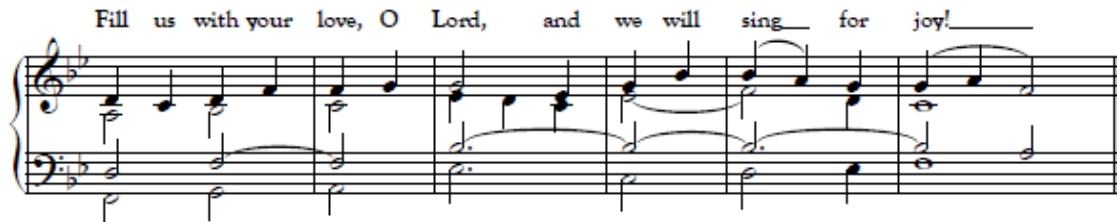
FIRST READING

MARK 10: 17-27

HOMILY

THE NICENE CREED

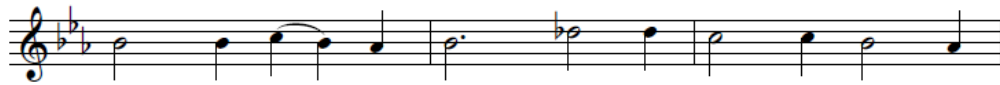


