The organ accompaniment will be performed by Shawn Kenney. He is very skilled at accompanying this particular religious silent movie. This will help you to prepare for the prayerfulness of Holy Week.

"Grand Old St. Mary's"

How will the rededication compare with the dedication in 1868? I am sure that Father Lutz has planned a rededication ceremony that will exceed the 1868 ceremony: Maybe fireworks, OSU band followed by various High School bands, clown performers, and huge balloons. The possibilities are endless. The rededication has probably been delayed for after Easter because Father Lutz needs the time to set it all up. CAN'T WAIT!!!! The following is a description of the 1868 ceremony.
The Most Reverend Archbishop John B. Purcell of the Diocese Cincinnati laid the cornerstone for the church in August of 1866. By the time of the dedication of the church, His Holiness Pope Pius IX had established the Diocese of Columbus on March 3, 1868 and appointed the Most Reverend Bishop Sylvester H. Rosecrans as the first Bishop. Bishop Rosecrans appointed Father Specht to be the founder and first pastor of Saint Mary Parish. The church is of gothic design. It is 62 1/2 feet wide, 140 feet long, 75 feet high, and 60 feet of that clear. The main altar is 45 feet high and 20 feet wide, and cost \$2,500. The pulpit and confessionals cost \$1,170. The church dedication took place on November 29, 1868. The Ohio State Journal of November 30 carried a detailed description of the affair. The newspaper article provided the following information. "At 9 1/2 o'clock the procession formed at Holy Cross church under the direction of Chief Marshall George D. Rodenfels followed by City of Columbus Police under the command of Lieut. James Hannan." There followed more than fifteen Catholic societies from Columbus, Dayton, Zanesville, and Newark. The parade included bands from those cities, led by Columbus' famous Hemmersbach band, and "all furnishing excellent music." The parade included marchers "with the decorations, rich and beautiful banners and flags presented a very fine appearance..." The ceremonies culminated with a Pontifical High Mass offered by Bishop Rosecrans at the new Saint Mary Church. "The exercises of the day closed with a grand sacred concert in the evening, which was well attended." The newspaper reported a profit of \$500 from the concert. A closer examination of the books revealed a profit of only \$496.89 as reported by the treasurer, George J. Kellner. Spiritual Vessel, Pray for us. Pray for Vocations.
