*"Grand Old Saint Mary's"*

With the Rededication of St. Mary church by Bishop Robert Brennan at the 11:00 Mass, it seems appropriate to look back at some of the restorations and renovations of the past. The first renovation would probably be the installation of three bells in 1870, followed by the purchase of a pipe organ in November 1875, which was rebuilt in 1901. The spire was constructed in 1893; yes St. Mary's did not have a spire for its first 25 years. The tower clock was not installed until 1894. It was 70 years, April 1963, before the original wooden steeple cross on the tower was replaced by the stainless steel cross of today. In August of 1926, the same time of the first homecoming, the pavement in front of the church was replaced. Was it as nice as what we have now? Probably not. Then of course, there was the painting and repair of the church tower in August of 1931. The work was necessary because of a lightning strike. I wonder if Father Burkley was in the church praying, as he was want to do, when the lightning struck, as Father Lutz was. This whole scenario sounds familiar. February 1940 saw the installation of a complete set of bell-ringers operated by automatic electric control in the sacristy. The apparatus was controlled by a switchboard and rang all bells including the Angelus and Elevation bells. In 1945 a "tiny 1 /150th horsepower motor replaced the two-ton weights that operated the clock. As a result, "George Schneider, 72, did not lose his 50-year-old job as clock-tender, Monsignor Burkley said he is now "chief oiler." In 1952, work on the tower was complete, the clock was being worked on so that it would strike correctly and interior lighting was being brightened in the church. 1973 saw the restoration of organ, which was rededicated March 1975 with a dedication concert by Dorothy Riley, organist at Christ Lutheran church. The work of renovation and restoration seems to be an endless task. Let us enjoy our splendidly restored church, and thank God, for everything He has given us.
