### "Grand Old Saint Mary's" Parish Veterans Remembrance World War II

Last Monday, was Memorial Day. Please keep our men and women in the military in your prayers.

The following is a continuing list of our Saint Mary heroes:  
Lt. Robert A. Gleich flew 23 missions over Japan in a B-29.  
Raymond Goodall served in Korea and worked on the Manhattan Atomic Bomb Project. Cpl. William A. Hoermle, U. S. Army Tank Corps, was seriously wounded 7 June 1944, during the Normandy Invasion. Radarman 3<sup>rd</sup> Class Jerome Jander received the Purple Heart for wounds received in Okinawa in 1944. Sgt. Anthony L. Kauderer survived action with the "Lost Battalion of Leyte" fighting the Japanese in the Philippines. SSgt. Kielblock was a member of the Eighth Air Force and used his fluent German to intercept messages between German fighter pilots on B-24 missions over Europe. He was killed near his ancestral home of Armstadt-Thuringen, October 7, 1944. Cpt. Charles W. King received the Distinguished Flying Cross for participating in more than 50 missions in a Lockheed P-38 Lightning in the southwest Pacific. Pfc. Joseph Kozman was killed in Germany March 22, 1945. 1Lt. Jack L. Kramer received the Bronze Star and Purple Heart for action in France. He was killed in action January 7, 1945 in Belgium. The Krauss family of 644 E. Sycamore Street had four sons in the service. SSgt John was in the Army Air Corps. Cpl. Richard (St. Mary High School, class of 1939) was in the Army Air Corps. Pfc. Daniel was in a medical detachment in Hawaii and Roman (Jim) was with the Navy Air Corps. Clem Lang served with an aviation squadron in the Atlantic as a Radioman 3<sup>rd</sup> class in 1945. Cpl. Mario Liberatore was killed in Italy on May 15, 1945 when his vehicle hit a German mine. Cpl. Victor J. Liberatore, brother of Mario was stationed in Germany in 1945. Wilbur A. Liddil in 1944 was serving, in the South Pacific, with the U. S. Navy. John F. Lynch, was promoted to SFC Air Mechanic while serving with his squadron in the war zone in 1942.  
The effort to establish a Saint Mary "Veterans Hall of Fame" is going nowhere. The primary source of information has been, unfortunately, obituaries. Could you please provide us any information about Saint Mary veterans, including those currently serving, by dropping it in the collection basket or sending me an email at [aequicker@aol.com](mailto:aequicker@aol.com). The best document would be a form DD214 with the SSN blacked out. Please include your contact information, if ok, so we can fill in blanks.
