2019 - Changes-Before During and After-Part 2

To continue last week's exploration of the apse area of the church and the changes, or those things that have remained the same over time. The six angels, dressed in priestly attire, three on each side of the apse represent some of the instruments of Christ's Passion. The angels were part of the redecoration of the church in the 1930's. The angels were painted by Gerhardt Lemars, an immigrant from Munich, Germany. The faces of the angels are said to be modeled after his daughters. The angels are holding the whips from the scourging, the crown of thorns, nails, hammer and pinchers to drive and remove the nails, Veronica's veil, the inscription I.N.R.I which was placed on the top of the cross. The inscription, I.N.R.I., on the top of the cross, translates to Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews. Under the angels on the left side of the apse is the inscription *Ecce lignum crucis in quo fatus mundi pependit* (Behold the wood of the cross on which hung the destiny of the world). Under the group on the right the inscription reads *Crux fidelis inter omnes arbor una nobis* (Faithful cross, most noble tree of all). At the apex of the apse appears the all-seeing eye on a gold background which represents God watching over us from heaven. The triangle symbolizes the Holy Trinity. There are also six oval paintings adorning the edge of the apse. They are the font of living water for which our souls long, the lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world, the pelican which pierces its breast to feed its young with its own blood symbolizing Christ's shedding his blood for our salvation, the fish, an early symbol of Christ, the Chi Rho, (XP) the first two letters of the Greek word for Christ, which suggest the form of the cross, the host and chalice representing the body and blood of Christ. The significance of the large urn between encircled crosses has not been determined. To be continued.
