"Grand Old St Mary's" 2019—Changes-Before, During and After Pt. 4

To continue last week's exploration of the church and the changes, or those things that have remained the same over time, let us look at the remaining area of the sanctuary and the rest of the church. The side altars, at one time were designed to match the main altar. There was the reredos with three statues on each side altar. On Mary's altar there was a statue of Saint Catherine of Siena and Saint Theresa of Lisieux. These statues are gone along with the wooden backdrop. On Joseph's altar were statues of Saint Francis of Assisi and a Saint I have yet to identify. The statue of Saint Francis is in the Saint Mary's room at the Jubilee Museum. The location of the other statues along with the wooden backdrops are unknown. Sitting on Mary's side of the sanctuary is a wooden structure called an *ambo*. This ambo replaces the pulpit that was removed from the south wall during the 1987 restoration. The pulpit was returned to the south wall during the current restoration. Traditionally, the epistle and gospel were delivered at the main altar, and the sermon was delivered from the pulpit. The 1987 restoration moved all three activities to the ambo. The current ambo is from a Methodist church. It takes the place of the pulpit that was returned to the south wall. The tabernacle was also moved from the south wall to its original place in the center of the high altar. The statue above the pulpit is the statue of Jesus as the good shepherd. The lamb on his shoulder is a symbol of Christ. The four statues around the pulpit are of evangelists, though one of them, Matthew, is a replacement. The original Matthew must have had a broken arm, and the repair was not proportional. The replacement most likely came from the Jubilee Museum. The Communion railing, which had been moved to the back of church in 1987, was returned to its original position in front of the sanctuary. A new addition is the twelve candles along the north and south walls. They were placed there for the consecration ceremony of the church performed by Bishop Brennan at the completion of the restoration. These candles represent the twelve apostles, and are lit on special occasions. The old Stations of the Cross were in storage with one of our parishioners, Julius Vargo, who saw to their restoration and return. There are two new statues at the rear of the church, the Infant of Prague on the north wall and Saint Ann on the south wall. The baptismal font has been returned to the rear of church and surrounded by a new wooden fence. It has been moved out of the alcove to make room for the new altar. The Pieta has been returned to the south alcove. In the main entry to the church, there is a memorial shrine to the Nativity. The memorial is from a Lutheran church in Akron, Ohio. This ends the examination of the main changes of the restoration.
