**A MESSAGE FROM THE DIOCESE**

The Diocese of Columbus, as part of its investigation procedure concerning Father Kevin F. Lutz and an allegation regarding sexual abuse of a minor, has scheduled outreach efforts to determine if other persons need to come forward and seek assistance. Msgr. Stephan J. Moloney, diocesan victim's assistance coordinator, will be available on Sunday, September 29<sup>th</sup>, at St. Mary Church, 672 South Third Street, Columbus, at 6:00 p.m. in the parish office second floor meeting room to privately discuss any incident or address issues or concerns relating to this inquiry. He will also be available on Wednesday, October 9<sup>th</sup>, at 6:00 p.m. at St. Christopher Church, 1420 Grandview Avenue, Columbus, in the church proper.

The Diocese of Columbus encourages anyone who may have experienced sexual abuse by clergy or others associated with the Church to contact the police and the diocesan victim's assistance coordinator at 614-224-2251, 866-448-0217, or at [helpisavailable@columbuscatholic.org](mailto:helpisavailable@columbuscatholic.org).
