Notes from the Pastor

We've always heard the expression, "taking a leap of faith", but have we thought about it? Do we know how strong our faith is, or, better yet, can we do anything to strengthen it or let it grow?

Faith is a real response of trust in something or someone and is a gift given by God. We believe in electricity, but can't see it with our own eyes, but know we can use electricity to power things we can't do on our own- faith in God works in the same way!

When God shows Himself to us In Jesus Christ, He gives us an assurance that His presence is more real than the presence of the world around us. Things around change constantly, but God never changes! May we pray that our faith continues to be strong and that our Lord fills us with His love and changes our hearts to love immensely and serve selflessly!
