Notes from the Pastor

In the gospel this weekend, we hear about mercy and lepers; nine Jewish lepers and one Samaritan leper asking for mercy.

First: the distinction between the Jewish and Samaritan lepers. Throughout the gospel, it shows the division between Jews and Samaritans. They have been divided for centuries and never had any dealings with each other, and if their paths crossed, violence would ensue.

But, we see a moment where Samaritans and Jews came together for mercy. Mercy literally means sad at heart, but mercy is more than just sorrow- it takes away suffering and seeks justice. A merciful person, shares in that other person's suffering as if it were their own, and do whatever it takes to remove that pain.

So what's so important about the ten lepers and showing mercy? The lepers knew they needed physical healing, but they also needed **spiritual healing** as well. They approached Jesus with faith **and** also with remorse for sinning because they knew Jesus could heal both soul and body.

So why did one leper out of ten return to thank Jesus? Because the Samaritan wanted to show how grateful he was that Jesus was merciful to him, and approach Jesus with respect and give praise to God.

May we recognize and appreciate the mercy and assistance shown to us from God and our neighbors in different situations, and be merciful to our neighbors in their time of need!
