As you may have already learned, the Catholic Bishops of Ohio have temporarily suspended all Masses and Liturgies until at least Easter – April 12th. Please see the letter below. For schedules for Corpus Christi and Saint Ladislav please visit www.stnartgv.org Obviously, St. Mary's will be implementing these guidelines. The suspensions apply to all Masses, Liturgies and other public gatherings, including Stations of the Cross. The suspension is in effect until at least Easter – April 12th. Of course, St. Mary's will offer funerals and even weddings, but these will be restricted to immediate families.

At this time our parish office will remain open Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays between 9:00 am and 2:00 pm. This is an ongoing and fluid situation; we will do our best to keep you updated and informed of any developments.

Please pray for all those affected by this virus, and that the efforts to halt the spread are successful.

News Worthy Notes

March 17, 2020

Dear Corpus Christi, St. Ladislav and St. Mary Families, Because of the decision to suspend public celebrations of all Masses/liturgies, the diocese has provided specific guidance on how best to proceed with celebrating the sacraments and allowing our sacred spaces to remain open for private prayer during this time. Here are the guidelines for each sacrament in sections, effective Wednesday, March 18th:

- Keeping Church Buildings Open for Personal Devotion
 - Our churches will remain open for private prayer of the faithful, confessions and for adoration of the Blessed Sacrament based on the following schedule:

- **Saint Mary schedule:**

Monday, Wednesday, Friday:

- Personal Prayer: 9:00 a.m. – noon
- Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament: Noon – 2:00 p.m. and 6:00 - 8:00 p.m.
- Confession: 6:00 – 8:00 p.m.

Saturday:

- Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament: 4:00 – 5:00 p.m.
- Confession: 2:00 – 3:00 p.m.

Sunday:

- Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament: 9:00 – 11:00 a.m.

- Mass
 - Priests are highly encouraged to offer Mass daily, if possible, but in a non-public way. Masses will be celebrated at a time other than the times the churches/chapel are open for private prayer of the faithful.
 - If anyone has any Mass Intentions that will not be obligated, they will be rescheduled for the future
- Spiritual Communion
 - There are opportunities to experience the Mass by going to CatholicTV.org, EWTN.com and Bishop Brennan's radio broadcast daily on St. Gabriel Radio (820 AM) at 12:05 PM

- Confirmations
 - All confirmations through April 12, 2020 are postponed and will be re-scheduled at a later date to be determined
- Baptism
 - Baptisms are possible based on pastoral urgency. In order to limit any potential spread of the virus to a vulnerable population, only small, private family Baptisms with only immediate family and godparents attending are allowed.
- Weddings
 - Some counties are not issuing marriage licenses. If a civil license is available, a wedding Mass can be celebrated with immediate family members only, keeping in mind the maximum number of persons in attendance according to government directives
- Funerals
 - Funeral Masses can be celebrated with immediate family members only, keeping in mind the maximum number of persons in attendance according to government directives
 - If at all possible, please schedule a Memorial Mass at a time when the current restrictions are lifted. The Rite of Committal may be celebrated at the cemetery with immediate family members only, keeping in mind the call for social distancing.
 - Please note that in the obituary, that the funeral Mass and burial are private family-only events
 - Please keep in mind the maximum number of persons in attendance according to government directives
- Ministering the Sacraments to the Sick and Homebound
 - All ordinary in person visits to the sick and homebound are cancelled for the duration of this emergency including for administering Holy Communion
 - Pastoral Ministers and ministers of Communion to the homebound are encouraged to contact the homebound by telephone or other means to offer comfort and support
- R.C.I.A.
 - Due to the suspension of all Masses and liturgies through Easter Sunday, the Sacraments of Initiation for Catechumens and Candidates in the R.C.I.A. program are postponed until the current restrictions are lifted
- **REMINDER**
 - All parish ministries and social activities, regardless of the number of people, should not be meeting IN PERSON during this time, including Religious Education, R.C.I.A., ministries, choir

These guidelines are subject to change as the situation develops. For those that do not have access to a computer or social media, please contact them and let them know the guidelines. I appreciate your understanding and let us entrust our prayers to Our Lady to implore her protection during this pandemic.
