**Notes from the Pastor**

This weekend is always a tough weekend for clergy because its Trinity Sunday and it's hard to preach a homily about the Trinity!

One way to help with learning about the Trinity is through Sacred Scripture. Sacred Scripture helps us learn about the Trinity and their relationships!

The first is God the Father. God shows His nature in Exodus (34:6) when He met Moses on Mount Sinai- He is a God who is merciful, forgiving and faithful.

Scripture also shows us that God is just and loving. God is against sin and evil and approaches them with right judgment and approaches sinners with mercy. John the Evangelist tells us that God the Father sent his Son into the world to redeem and not to condemn; to heal and restore and not to destroy. God does not want anyone to die (Ezekiel 18:23,32 and 33:11) but gives us the freedom to choose between good and evil; life and death!

God the Father also sent His Son Jesus to free us from sin and death, and to offer us eternal life as adopted sons and daughters of God through the cross! He was THE sacrifice for our sins and THE offering to the Father on our behalf, which is proof of God's love for all humanity! Jesus life was lived by love and obedience; He loved us first in order to make us children of God. We were created to be with God and to share in His love forever and to have God's Son love us shows how much He wants us to be united with Him!

This love is shown through the Trinity, which is a perfect union of Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and Jesus' goal is to show the glory of God, which is a Trinity of persons and to unite us with God in that love! And the mission of the Holy Spirit is the same as Jesus' mission, to show the glory of the Father and the Son.

So how can we know more about the Trinity? It's the Holy Spirit who shows us the Father and the Son and who gives us faith to know and understand the Scriptures! It's through the sacrament of Baptism we receive the Holy Spirit that helps us open our hearts and do His work on earth!

May we ask Jesus to renew in us the gift of the Holy Spirit so we may do God's will in all we do!

- Pray for peace in our nation as we continue to pray for an end to racism and for reconciliation and peace

**Finance Committee Meeting Minutes Tuesday, May 26<sup>th</sup>, 2020**

- **Approval of Minutes of April 27<sup>th</sup>, 2020 Meeting**
  - Correction: PPP is \$427K instead of \$480K
- **Results & Key Statistics**
  - April 2020 Financial Statements
    - Parish: The parish is still ahead of plan because of the \$80K bequest
    - School Tuition receipts show on an accrual basis. School is \$39K ahead of planned for the year
    - PPP Notes: Forgiveness of the loan is possible, but we will not know until a later date; this is being monitored closely by the diocesan financial office. 20% is being set-aside just in case it needs to be repaid
    - Balance Sheet: Shows March total and April total
  - Capital Campaign Update – see worksheet
    - Outstanding balance is \$2.07 million; only a small gain during April
- **Old Business**
  - Renovation Donor Acknowledgement
    - Deacon Minner and Mo Meuse are looking at a model of a donor acknowledgment piece from Saint Margaret of Cortona and another model from North Carolina to determine how it would be best to move forward with a piece at Saint Mary Church
    - One possible gift could be returning the plaques to the donors with a piece of the original church (similar to a gift from the Ohio Theatre)
  - Events Update
    - Gala: Will be held remotely beginning June 12<sup>th</sup>
      - Kayla will send information to the parishioners (one invitation and a few reminders)
    - Homecoming: In-person event has been canceled, but there will be two fundraising opportunities in place of this event:
      - Commemorative book
      - Student drawing post-cards
        - Dee Printing will make these at a free/reduced rate
        - Mailing should include a space to write their email addresses and cell phone numbers
  - School Tuition Update
    - Pending tuition receipts: **\$259,690.18**
    - FACTS will be used during the 2020-2021 academic year for all families unless their tuition is paid-in-full before the last day of school (June 5<sup>th</sup>, 2020)
- **New Business**
  - Inspection of Financial Records: Dave will coordinate a date with Roger and will come in next month
  - FY21 Parish Budget- 1<sup>st</sup> draft
    - BAA and festival have been left blank
    - Roger will investigate "Interest Paid"
    - There is a projected deficit of \$78K
