**Notes from the Pastor****Joint Parish Council Meeting Notes  
June 22, 2020 Meeting Parameters**

- Like all parish council meetings, this meeting is the same, with an agenda and what needs to be discussed- this is NOT an open town hall meeting forum and is limited to an hour
- Parishioners may come and listen to the meeting, but due to COVID restrictions this meeting is currently limited to parish council members

**New Business:**

- Pastor's Perspective
  - Rough couple of months due to COVID-19; it's been hard for Fr. Vince since he does not see all of you in the pews- celebrating Mass with no congregation is not fun
- Situation at hand for South End Parishes
  - Bishop Brennan and Fr. Vince had a conversation about what's going on in the South End during COVID-19. He asked about the priests that I've been using to cover 3 parishes; Bishop Brennan said those priests are in the age bracket that cannot be out during the pandemic. Bishop said it needs to change and said that temporarily we need to move the Masses to one parish until we find a solution
- Process
  - Preliminary Joint Parish Council Meeting  
With the situation at hand with 1 priest on the South End, can we collaborate together and support the initiatives? Parish groups/ministries/etc. for parishes- Can we merge duplicate ministries to work together?  
○ Survey to all parishioners: Knowing the situation of the Catholic churches in the South End of Columbus (1 priest for the entire South End of town), how will you preserve the faith in the South End? What would be a solution?  
○ Once surveys are compiled another joint parish council meeting will be convened.  
○ Joint Parish Council will review the survey answers and schedule meetings at the parishes.  
○ Parishioners will have the opportunity to discuss the situation at hand at each parish  
○ Joint Parish Council will compile and form a solution to submit to Bishop Brennan
- Questions from the Presidents of the Councils
  - Are we reopening or not? That is a question Bishop Brennan has to answer. Right now, the diocese has a priest shortage, and is now relying on retired priests to cover parishes (Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Grove City) throughout the diocese. Bishop Brennan is asking the parishes to participate and come up with a recommendation and ultimately he makes the decision.  
○ The Collection- is it going to St. Mary's? Why should we still give to Corpus Christi and St. Ladislav? As long as the funds are in an envelope specifically notating what church they should be going to, the funds will go to their respective parish. Loose funds will go to St. Mary's since they are holding Masses. The Latino Mass funds are going to St. Ladislav.  
○ Corpus Christi and St. Ladislav still have bills and expenses to pay (payroll) and continue to need your support  
○ Why isn't Mass being offered at Corpus Christi and St. Ladislav? Due to the pandemic, Masses are only offered at St. Mary's due to sanitization rules (after Mass or any activity in the church, it needs to be sanitized)  
○ What happens to Catechesis of the Good Shepherd? Catechesis of the Good Shepherd will still go on at St. Ladislav, but due to the pandemic the schedule has not been finalized. We will get official word once we get closer to Fall. Those that are receiving the Sacraments from Corpus Christi and St. Ladislav will still receive the Sacraments, but due to pandemic, are on hold until we get a better understanding of the schedule.

- How about the other ministries/programs such as Promise on Parsons and Senior Stars? Other ministries and programs will still happen but, due to the pandemic, some groups cannot meet (Senior Stars are in a higher age bracket and cannot have meetings in the church).

- It seems Corpus Christi and St. Ladislav have different COVID-19 rules than other parishes. Why? Bishop Brennan has given the responsibility of laying rules and regulations to the respective Pastor of the parishes

· House of Discernment for the Servants of the Word

- The Servants of the Word has been looking to create a discernment house for those interested in entering the priesthood or religious life in the Midwest/East Coast. Bishop Brennan has written a letter regarding a House of Discernment. The Bishop's request has been approved for a discernment house at Corpus Christi Rectory for woman The Dominican Learning Center has been notified and is excited for the opportunity to work with them. The order will be filled for the use of the facility. We are waiting for the agreement from the diocese to be submitted to the Servants of the Word so they can move in
