**Updates from Father**

Freedom from sin through the cross. I wonder how Jesus felt when He realized He had to go through rejection, crucifixion and then resurrection and how He felt when He told his disciples the news.

Jesus knew that He would face the cross so we can be free from sin and when He told His disciples, they probably could not believe it! Of course, Peter responds and wants to protect Jesus and did not believe Jesus would go through such things.

Jesus responds to Peter calling Him Satan. Why? When Jesus was in the wilderness, He was tempted by the devil to follow a different way than the one chosen by God, and now Jesus sees another temptation in Peter's response, another way than the way of the cross!

The word "Satan" means adversary- Peter's role is not to be an adversary, but a disciple- one who follows with trust and obedience!

Jesus knew the only way he could save us from sin was through His death on the cross, which defeated Satan and the power of death! And through His resurrection, He overcame the grave so we may be partakers in heaven!

Jesus also told His disciples that they must be willing to lay down their lives in order to have everlasting life with God the Father in Heaven!

If we try to live our lives our own way, it can be disastrous; if we truly surrender our lives to God, He gives us new life in the Holy Spirit and eternal life with Him!

A true disciple is willing to give and sacrifice everything for freedom and eternal life! May we take up any crosses we have in our daily lives like Our Lord did on the cross, and may we be willing to lose everything, so we can gain everything with Jesus Christ!
