ST. CHARLES OFFERING ANNUAL 8TH GRADE SCHOLARSHIP TEST AND PRIVATE FAMILY VISITS

St. Charles Preparatory School is offering its annual **8th Grade Scholarship Test** for prospective students on January 30, 2021. Students may take the test at either 9 a.m. or 1 p.m. in the school's Robert C. Walter Student Commons. Online registration is required. The exam is open to any 8th grade boy regardless of his current high school enrollment status. This is not an entrance exam. Test results determine which students will receive *merit-based* academic awards from the school for the 2021-2022 school year. For this 2020-21 school year alone, St. Charles has offered more than \$400,000 in *academic* scholarships and grants to its students.
