Dear brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus, I, Joseph Raj MMI, come with my heart filled with gratitude and happiness to share my joy with you. I feel blessed to be here among you in Holy Cross and St. Patrick’s Church. I pray that the almighty God bless everyone in our parish and all those who are in need of our prayers. We have just begun the new month i.e. August which is dedicated for vocations. This month and its nature invites us to pray for more vocations to religious life and to Christian life. We may wonder of what is this vocation to Christian life. Vocation does not mean only to the life of celibacy rather it also includes the call to live as a true Christian. In that sense, every one receives his or her vocation according to the grace received from above. Christ is the head of all and each of us is His parts, everyone receives different functions. Henceforth, we need to pray that all of us realize the call of God which comes to us in various ways and at different times.

The Catholic Church recognizes **four main vocations**. **Priesthood:** A Catholic priest is a male ordained minister of the Church. Because they give their lives in total service to the Church, priests embrace the gift of celibacy and commit to a life of prayer. They proclaim the Good News, teach the Catholic faith, minister the Sacraments, work to build up their local faith community and lead their faith community in worship. **Religious Life:** A religious priest, brother or sister (nun) commits his or her life to sharing in the life and mission of their religious community. Religious priests, brothers and sisters embrace the call to poverty, chastity and obedience, and nurture their call through a life of celibacy, faith, prayer and service. **Marriage:** A married person lives a vow of faithful love to a spouse through the sacrament of marriage. Husbands and wives share a self-giving, love-giving and life-giving relationship with their spouse, and are committed to helping their spouse grow to human and Christian maturity. **Single Life:** A person called to single life comes to believe that remaining single is the true and right way to faithfully live his or her baptismal call. In each vocation, the person lives a life of faith and prayer to continually grow in relationship with God. The Church recognizes that each vocation is equal in the sense that no vocation is better or less than any other. However, because God calls you to a particular vocation - whether marriage, priesthood, religious life or single life - that vocation is the best one for you, and the one that will 'fit' you best and make you the most happy.
