

Following upon the teaching of the Beatitudes, Jesus uses the now familiar metaphors of salt and light to describe the life of discipleship. Jesus' call to be salt for the earth and light for the world powerfully states our mission as Church and as Christians. Our commitment to social justice flows from the exhortation that Jesus gives us in today's Gospel. Some of the activities that this commitment leads us to are given more concrete expression as the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. When we feed the hungry, clothe the naked, console those who mourn, and so on, we show ourselves to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world. When we do these things with the community of faith, the Church, we are indeed acting as "a city set on a mountain" that cannot be hidden!



St. Scholastica (Feb-10)

“If men knew the peace good Religious enjoy, the whole would become a monastery.”

St. Scholastica is a saint of the Catholic Church. She was the twin sister of St. Benedict of Nursia. She was consecrated to God at her birth, but continued to live at home until her brother founded his monastery. She then established a convent nearby. St. Scholastica is the foundress of the women’s branch of Benedictine Monasticism.

WORLD DAY OF THE SICK

LITURGY OF WORD

The **first reading** is taken from Isaiah 58:7-10. When lowliness unites all men, then God will fill the need of the world with his glorious presence. The final age will have to come.

The **second reading** is from St. Paul 1 Corinthians 2:1-5. We continue this week with Paul’s first letter to the Corinthians as he addresses divisions within the Church. This week he reminds us that we are to pay attention to what is important - we are to hear the clear message of the crucified Christ and pay attention to it and not the messenger.

The **Gospel** is from St. Matthew 5:13-16. No less an authority than Christ himself calls his true followers **the “salt of the earth” and the “light of the world.”** These are titles of honor, surely, and of the greatest distinction. Christ is putting his true follower on almost a level with himself.

The Christian who does corporal and spiritual works of mercy, continues the work of salvation during his/her years on earth. Thus, he/she is the salt of the earth and the light of the world. How many of us, can truly say that these honorable titles, which Christ gives to his followers, are given to us?
