St. Augustine's famous prayer:

“O Lord my God, I believe in you, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Insofar as I can, insofar as you have given me the power, I have sought you. I became weary and I labored. O Lord my God, my sole hope, help me to believe and never to cease seeking you.”

Foundation of Faith

All Christians are introduced to the Holy Trinity on the occasion of their baptism. With these sacred words, the Holy Trinity takes up residence in our souls: I baptize you “in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit” (ccc. 232).

In this first sacrament of the Church, we are introduced to the truth that there exists only One God in a Trinity of Persons. The Catechism, using the teaching inspired by Pope Vigilius I in the year 552, explains that “Christians are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit: not in their names ...” (ccc 233).

Quoting from the Gospel of St. Matthew 28:19, Pope Vigilius I provides us with the correct interpretation of this passage in Sacred Scripture, explaining that we are baptized “in the name of” (God), as this passage tells us, and not “in the names of,” thus the Sacred Scripture even uses grammatical style to teach the truth that God revealed himself as a Trinity of Persons in One God.



LITURGY OF WORD

First Reading: Dt 4:32–34, 39-40

Second Reading: Rom 8:14-17

Gospel Reading: Mt 28:16-20



Today's feast invites us to live in the awareness of the presence of the Triune God within us: The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The mystery of the Holy Trinity, a doctrine enunciated by the ecumenical councils of Nicaea and Constantinople, is one of the fundamental doctrines of Christianity and the greatest mystery of our Faith, namely, **that there are Three Divine Persons, sharing the same Divine Nature in one God.** **“There is one God, who has three Persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Each Person is God, yet there is still only one God”** (CCC #234, #253-256). We have the Father Who is the Creator, the Son Who is the Redeemer and the Holy Spirit Who is the Sanctifier and the Counselor. The doctrine of Three Persons in one God, co-equal and co-eternal in Divinity yet distinct in Person, is not explicitly spelt out in the Bible. Even the very word “Trinity” is not found in the Bible.

All the official prayers of the Church, including the Holy Mass and the Sacraments, begin with an address to the Holy Trinity: *“In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.”* We are baptized, absolved of our sins, and anointed in the name of the Blessed Trinity. Throughout the world, when Church bells ring three times a day, Christians are being invited to pray to God the Father (the Provider); God the Son (the Savior); and God the Holy Spirit (the Sanctifier), giving glory to the Triune God for the Incarnation of the Son and our Redemption through His suffering and death, as we pray the *Angelus*, or in the Easter Season, the *Regina Coeli*. Today's readings convey the fundamental mystery that the Triune God reaches out to people with love, seeking the deepest communion with them.
