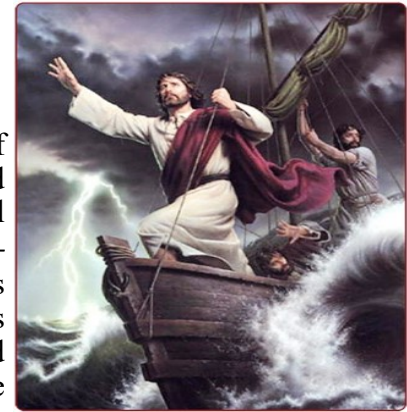

LITURGY OF WORD

First Reading: Job 38:1, 8-11
Second Reading: 2 Cor 5:14-17
Gospel Reading: Mk 4:35 – 41

The role of God in calming the storms of life both in the history of the Church and in the lives of Christians is the central theme of the readings for this *Storm Sunday*. In the first reading, God addresses Job for the first time, questioning his right to challenge God's authority and leading Job deeper and deeper into the mystery of creation. We hear how the Lord speaks to Job whose life was devastated by storms of the total loss of his possessions, the deaths of his dear ones, and a whole-body disease that left him in misery. "*Out of the storm,*" God reminds Job that He is in control.



Paul, who "rode the storm" of rejection by his former friends, also experienced storms of violent hostility from the Jews who refused to believe that Jesus was the promised Messiah. So, he explains in the second reading that Jesus died for us to make us a "*new creation.*" In order to receive this gift of love, we have to respond, living for Jesus in all situations of our lives because Jesus has gone before us through the uncharted sea of life. In today's Gospel, Mark assures the first-century believers that nothing can harm the Church as long as the risen Lord is with them. He describes how, by a single commanding word, Jesus stilled a storm on the Sea of Galilee, returned the sea to its natural order and saved the apostles from drowning. The incident reminds us that Jesus, resting in our life's boat is always ready to help us in the storms of life, when we ask.
