A LETTER FROM OUR SEMINARIAN, ED BURKE

Dear Friends, Family, and Benefactors,

Hello from Rome. As part of my seminary formation I am now in the midst of a semester of study in the heart of the church. I am living with 13 other American college seminarians at the Pontifical Irish College and taking classes at The Pontifical College of St. Thomas Aquinas (The Angelicum).

There are so many opportunities to grow in love for Christ's Church: beautiful churches with awesome saints buried in them are super abundant; classes are filled with priests, seminarians, and religious from around the world; and no matter where you go, God is God, and the Church is Catholic.

The Angelicum is astounding. Every day on our way there we walk past the Coliseum and many churches. Once we get there, we sit in classrooms where the future Pope St. John Paul II learned (the buildings were built by Pope St. Pius V). Our professor of moral theology is a Polish Dominican who speaks 8 languages and is the Papal moral Theologian – he was appointed to the post by John Paul II and still serves to this day. There is Eucharistic adoration in the chapel on every class day, so it is easy to visit Jesus between classes.

It is a huge blessing to continue my studies and come closer to the priesthood. I have a total of four years of college seminary followed by four years of major seminary before ordination. With five and a half years left to go, I hope to be ordained in the summer of 2024 as a priest for the Archdiocese of Anchorage.

It is a well-known saying that “the priest is not his own”, the same is true for seminarians. There is no way I could do this without your prayers, sacrifices, and support. It is the recognition that all my formation really comes down to bringing the Lord to His people that keeps me going when things get tough and I can't stand Rome's air pollution. It is thrilling to be doing God's will and I promise to pray for you all while I am over here. For those of you in Kenai, I hope to see you when I come back for the summer.
