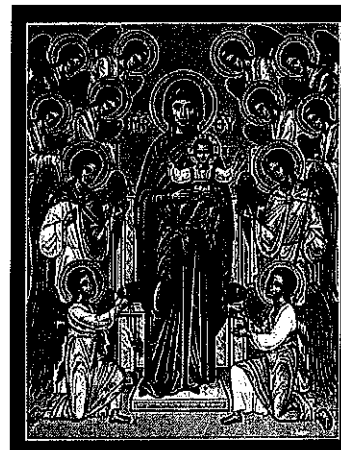

One Minute Study:

Last week we raised the question of emphasizing the cross. To our modern minds this certainly can challenge many. Yet we also asked should we not emphasize the Resurrection? St. Paul clearly places the Resurrection in a very significant place in our faith when he tells us in 1 Corinthians 15:14, "And if Christ has not been raised, then empty (too) is our preaching; empty, too, your faith." Clearly both the cross and resurrection are as two bookends of what we preach about Christ. If Christ did not rise from the dead, our faith is meaningless. For it is in the triumph of the cross that we see that Christ was truly the son of God. The cross is not the end, it is the transformative act that fixed a broken relationship between fallen man and our Father in heaven. The cross moved us into a new relationship with the Trinity; now we are adoptive children of God. We are a resurrected people. So, let us embrace the two bookends, the cross and the resurrection as the gospel to be preached. Let us again take up this next week.

Year End Report

June 30, 2020

Our Lady of the Angels Parish began an active year of religious and social activities with our new priest Fr. Michael Ko. But parish activities came to an abrupt halt when the Covid-19 virus hit in March resulting in church closure and economic down-turn. Due to the generosity of our parishioners, Offertory Collections and Miscellaneous Donations came in right on budget.

The parish did have to pay \$10,589 additional to the Archdiocese for the shortfall in donations to the One Bread One Body campaign. Due to a slump in the investment market, there was a loss of \$1,922 in Investment and Interest income.

The Capital Campaign donations this year totaled \$23,543. This money is held in a dedicated account with restrictions and is not reflected in operating revenues or expenditures. At this time, the campaign is put on hold with hopes of finishing the projects next summer.

The fiscal year ended with a deficit of \$3,844.

The financial condition of the parish continues to be good with \$528,915 in current assets and no debt.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Clergy changes for the new Archdiocese of Anchorage-Juneau will be announced soon.

There are some clergy changes that will affect your parish, effective October 1, 2020. I want to inform you of those changes before the formal announcement is posted on our website.

Father Michael Ko, who is currently serving as the pastor of Our Lady of the Angels parish in Kenai will move to Anchorage. He is appointed parochial vicar of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish.

Father Patrick Brosamer will continue as pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish in Soldotna, but he will assume the added responsibility of pastor of Our Lady of the Angels parish in Kenai.

Father Robert Whitney will move from Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton parish in Anchorage to join Father Patrick Brosamer in Soldotna. Father Whitney is appointed parochial vicar of both Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Soldotna and Our Lady of the Angels parish in Kenai to assist Father Brosamer.

I am grateful to these priests for their ministry and accepting these assignments. Let us continue to pray for and support our dedicated priests.
