
THE PRAYER PLACE AT ST. MARY'S

GOSPEL REFLECTIONS:

IS 49: 1-6; PS 139: 1B-3, 13-15; ACTS 13: 22-26; LK 1: 57-66, 80



Today is Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist (the Feast Day of the birth of John the Baptist). To say John the Baptist and Jesus were closely related and connected is understatement.

prophets, especially Isaiah. The only record of the birth of John the Baptist appears in the Gospel of Luke and it is at the heart of our Gospel Reading today. A key player in this event is, of course, John the Baptist's father Zechariah. Zechariah was a Jewish priest, but when the Archangel Gabriel revealed to him that he would father a child, Zechariah refused to believe it. As a result he was

rendered speechless until John was born.

Zechariah had total trust in the Lord, however. Although it was traditional at that time to name the first son after the father, he and Elizabeth had been told that they were to name him John. As reported in the Gospel, Elizabeth said "He will be called John." The family protested at which time Zechariah wrote "His name is John." When he did that, Zechariah could speak once more. He did not say "should be"; he said "is."

The trust shown by Zechariah is an example to us that we must trust in God, not just when it is convenient, but all the time. Those of advanced generations know who Lawrence Welk was. Born and raised Catholic, Welk practiced his faith throughout his life. He once said, "Never trust anyone completely but God. Love people, but put your full trust only in God."



SUMMER MISSIONARY APPEAL

Please join us in welcoming Fr. Caluza, a Missionhurst - CICM (the Congregation of the Immaculate Heart of Mary) missionary who will be visiting our parish the weekend of June 30-July 1 to present a mission appeal. Fr. Ramon is from the foreign mission of RP and will be sharing his life and dedication to the people he serves with us.

Missionhurst, the Congregation of the Immaculate Heart of Mary was founded in Brussels, Belgium, in 1862 for the conversion of China. The missionary activity in China was centered in Inner Mongolia. In 1888 the Congregation accepted missionary responsibility for the Congo. Later Missionhurst accepted to send missionaries to many other mission countries. At present the Congregation numbers approximately 830 members.

All priests and brothers are at the service of the local dioceses and most work at the parish level. They are involved with setting up basic Christian communities, training and supporting local lay leaders. Carrying on the work of evangelization and alphabetization, assisting with the promotion of social activities and in the setting up of local projects that will help in the development of their people.

After their initial seminary training in their countries of origin, Missionhurst has two regional Theological study programs located in the Philippines (English) and Cameroon (French). Presently 115 young men are in Formation, plus 155 who are beginning their formation process in the novitiate and pre-novitiate programs in Africa, Haiti, Indonesia, and the Philippines.

Missionhurst seeks to serve in those areas that are particularly affected by political instability, climate harshness and or lack of social and natural resources. We help and serve the poorest of the poor. The fund-raising activities of Missionhurst in the United States are exclusively for the Missionhurst missionaries around the world.

Missionhurst supports a variety of projects around the world from pastoral, economic development, education, relief and health care. These projects are all initiated by our priests and brothers in their local parishes.

Fr. Ramon will be preaching at all the masses and a second collection will be taken with proceeds going to Missionhurst - CICM.
