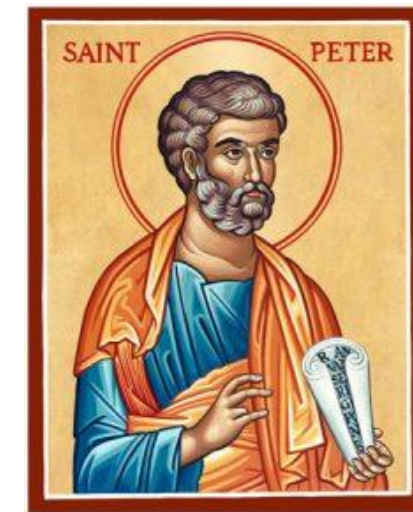

In today's first reading, Joshua challenges the people to decide whom they will serve. Recalling God's faithfulness to them and to their ancestors, the people declare, "We also will serve the Lord, for he is our God." May we, too, be mindful of God's gifts to us and renew our commitment to serve Him with grateful hearts.

GOSPEL REFLECTIONS:

Jos 24:1-2a; Ps 34; Eph 5:21-32; Jn 6:60-69



In today's Gospel reading, Jesus continues His instruction on the Eucharist. Many of his own disciples cannot accept His teachings and instead return to their former way of life, abandoning Christ altogether. Jesus turns to the

Apostles and asks them to choose with the question, "Do you also want to leave?" Peter speaks up for the Twelve responding, "Master, to Whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."

The demands of a stewardship way of life can be difficult. And the teachings of Christ can be hard to accept. How can we keep going when it gets tough? Peter's honest answer to the choice Jesus poses shows us a way to stay true to a stewardship way of life.

Looking at himself and the world around him, Peter comes to a realization. To paraphrase, he says, "I don't really see any better options, Lord. I've tried life with you and it's hard. But I've tried life without You and it's harder — it doesn't satisfy. Where else am I going to go? I choose You, Lord." Peter knows he doesn't have all the answers. And, so, he humbly chooses to rely on God. When the going gets tough, we can keep going by relying on God and trusting more deeply in Him.

Remembering blessings and relying on Him — these are two keys to a beautiful way of life.

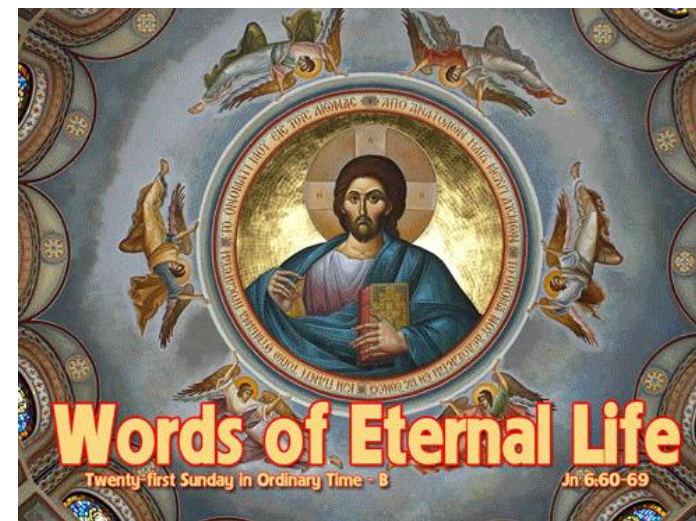

The **Sunday Morning Bible Study** will use the Dynamic Catholic Bible Study on the *Gospel of St John called, The Turning Point*. This edition of the Gospel of John reads like an engaging novel. It does away with the two-column format and distracting notes in the margins, making it easy for you to encounter Jesus through John the apostle's unique perspective as one of Jesus' closest friends. DVDs are used in the sessions each week. This study is a nine-week session that's perfect for people who want to get to know Jesus in the Scriptures. This study will introduce you to people and stories in the Gospel of John that you won't find anywhere else in the Bible: 1)the woman at the well; 2)a man named Nicodemus; 3)the woman caught in adultery; 4)and Lazarus, the friend Jesus raised from the dead. You'll read stories about 5)Jesus turning water into wine at the wedding in Cana, 6)Jesus washing the feet of his disciples, and 7)Peter's marvelous redemption after he denies Jesus three times.

This session of the Sunday Morning Bible Study starts September 9 after 8:30 am Mass and dismisses at 10:30 am when the Religious Ed classes dismiss. Books will be available soon.
