And as the letter from St. Peter reminds us this Sunday that "with the Lord one day is like a thousand years and a thousand years like one day." And the amazing thing is that when this happens, we end up becoming more human and happier in the process. If we call to mind some of our greatest Advents and Christmas of the past, they typically will involve moments when we are not so focused on our selves or the pressures of the season, but quiet and still moments where we can simply be the people God wants us to be. I hope and pray that in this Advent season, we develop a greater appreciation of God's gift of time to us, and how we can use it better to prepare our hearts for the coming of the Lord.

Uniting our hearts in Christ through change, by Deacon Steve Miller

In recent weeks our diocese has undergone a lot of change. The creation of new parish pastorates, restructured deaneries and the assignment of missionary pastors has invited us to embrace much change in our lives. This transformation is calling us to new ways of thinking, seeing, experiencing and living as a Local Church.

Change can be a good and positive occurrence in our life. Change challenges us to look deep within our hearts, to examine our dispositions and responses regarding the events around us. Through change we learn more about ourselves, how we perceive the world around us, and how we react to such challenges.

Change can be difficult depending on the various demands it makes. It can mean wrestling with some unknowns, which can make us anxious or fearful.

No matter what our perspective or response to change may be, earthly living requires us to confront change from time to time. Life never stands still.

As Catholics we are called to approach change with *faith*. To have faith in God's loving plan of salvation. Although God has revealed much about His plan of salvation to us, how it unfolds is never fully known or completely understood. We are called to trust in God's providential care and His desire to give us what is truly good.

We must hunger and thirst for holiness, seeking intimacy with God in daily prayer, through His grace, in the frequent reception of the sacraments, the Eucharist and reconciliation. We must reject sin, earthly attachments and passions to become united with God and one another. This is the essence of *uniting in heart*.

As we begin this new and exciting time in our diocese, let us receive the change we have been presented with holiness and joy, going forth as humble servants of Christ, united in mission, and glorifying His name through patience, kindness, compassion, and mercy.

GOSPEL REFLECTIONS:

IS 40:1-5, 9-11; PS 85:9-14; 2 PT 3:8-14; MK 1:1-8

We serve a merciful and patient God. In His kindness, He warns us that we will be called to make an account one day for the way in which we made use of the gifts He has given us.

The most precious gift He has given us is His own Son, whose birth we are preparing to celebrate.

St. Peter describes the loving kindness of the Father in our Second Reading today, saying God "is patient with you, not wishing that anyone should perish but that all should come to repentance." Yet, in the same passage we receive this warning: "The Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a mighty roar... and the earth and everything on it will be found out."

How are we to assimilate these two truths — the merciful love of God and the responsibility that comes with the privilege of living as His disciple? St. Peter tells us we should conduct ourselves "in holiness and devotion." Indeed, this is the goal of our Advent "reset" — to return to living lives focused on Christ, in gratitude for all He has done for us.

In our Gospel passage from Mark, John the Baptist instructs us to "prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." We must make good use of the gift of time we have been given this Advent season. Let's be sure to get to Confession, prioritize a daily reading the of Scriptures, and reach out to someone in need with a word of comfort or an act of service.

In this way, we will honor both the mercy and justice of our God, and we will be prepared to celebrate the birth of Christ and give account for all His gifts to us.
