## **Summer Work – 2020 – All work is recommended, but not mandatory this summer**

### **Incoming Grades K, 1, 2**

- Attend Mass, say your prayers, and teach one of the new prayers you learned this year to your family and recite it together. Complete a service project with your family. Share your experience in the fall.
- Read for 15-30 minutes a day or have someone read to you each night. Journal and draw about your reading. Check out this reading list here: <http://www.ala.org/alsc/publications-resources/book-lists/2020-summer-reading-list> Be ready to tell the new classmates about one of the books you read.
- **Grade K:** Search online for sight word practice, work on number and letter identification/sounds
- **Grade 1:** Begin to memorize math facts: addition and subtraction facts, work on sight words
- **Grade 2:** Come to school in September with addition and subtraction math facts memorized
- **Recommended:** Complete a Summer Solutions workbook or two in math/reading for the incoming grade level: <https://www.summersolutions.net/>
- Take a break from electronics during the day. Learn to play a safe, fun game outside that involves no equipment and teach it to your friends at recess next year.

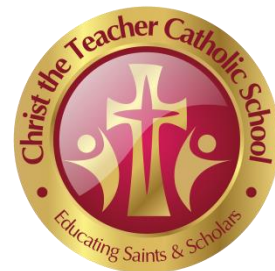
### **Incoming Grades 3, 4, 5**

- Attend Mass, say your prayers, and teach one of the new prayers you learned this year to your family and recite it together. Complete a service project with your family. Share your experience in the fall.
- **Highly Recommended:** Complete a Summer Solutions workbook or two in math/reading for the incoming grade level: <https://www.summersolutions.net/>
- Read for 45-60 minutes a day. Read 2 full books, preferably one is non-fiction and one is fiction. Check out this list here: <http://www.ala.org/alsc/publications-resources/book-lists/2020-summer-reading-list> Be ready to tell the new classmates about one of the books you read.
- **Grade 3:** Come to school in September with math facts memorized: addition and subtraction facts and begin to memorize multiplication/division facts 0-6.
- **Grade 4:** Must come to school in September with multiplication and division facts (0-12) memorized
- Take a break from electronics during the day. Learn to play a safe, fun game outside that involves no equipment and teach it to your friends at recess next year.
- **Grade 5:** Must come to school in September with multiplication and division facts (0-12) memorized

### **Incoming Grades 6, 7, 8**

- Attend Mass, say your prayers, and teach one of the new prayers you learned this year to your family and recite it together. Complete a service project with your family. Share your experience in the fall.

  - Your goal should be 30 WPM (words per minute, at 90% or above accuracy)

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- Read for 60-75 minutes a day. Read 2 full books, preferably one is non-fiction and one is fiction. - Be ready to tell the new classmates about one of the books you read.
