Incoming Grades K, 1, 2

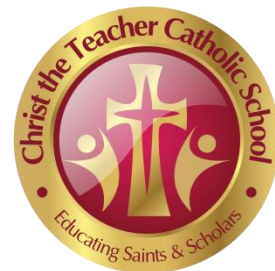
- Attend Mass, say your prayers, and teach one of the new prayers you learned this year to your family and recite it together. Complete a service project with your family. Share your experience in the fall.
- Read for 15-30 minutes a day or have someone read to you each night. Journal and draw about your reading. Your teachers recommend using the Epic App (found in the app store on your tablets and devices)
- **Grade K:** Search online for sight word practice, work on number and letter identification/sounds.
- **Grade 1:** Begin to memorize math facts: addition and subtraction facts, work on sight words.
- **Grade 2:** Come to school in September with addition and subtraction math facts memorized.
- All Grades: Practice handwriting your lower and uppercase letters.
- **Highly Recommended:** Complete a Summer Solutions workbook or two in math/reading: <https://www.summersolutions.net/> Choose the level that matches the grade your child has just completed.
- Take a break from electronics during the day. Learn to play a safe, fun game outside that involves no equipment and teach it to your friends at recess next year.

Incoming Grades 3, 4, 5

- Attend Mass, say your prayers, and teach one of the new prayers you learned this year to your family and recite it together. Complete a service project with your family. Share your experience in the fall.
- **Highly Recommended:** Complete a Summer Solutions workbook or two in math/reading: <https://www.summersolutions.net/> Choose the level that matches the grade your child has just completed.
- Read for 30-45 minutes a day. Read 2 full books, preferably one is non-fiction and one is fiction. Be ready to tell the new classmates about one of the books you read.
- **Grade 3:** Must come to school in September with math facts memorized: addition and subtraction facts and optional: begin to memorize multiplication facts
- **Grade 4/5:** Must come to school in September with multiplication and division facts (0-12) memorized
- Take a break from electronics during the day. Learn to play a safe, fun game outside that involves no equipment and teach it to your friends at recess next year.

Incoming Grades 6, 7, 8

- Attend Mass, say your prayers, and teach one of the new prayers you learned this year to your family and recite it together. Complete a service project with your family. Share your experience in the fall.
- **Incoming Grade 6:** Sign up and practice typing www.typing.com
 - Your goal should be 30 WPM (words per minute, at 90% or above accuracy)
- **Highly Recommended:** Complete a Summer Solutions workbook or two in math/reading: <https://www.summersolutions.net/> Choose the level that matches the grade your child has just completed.
- **Required Reading:** Read 45-60 minutes each day. Visit www.arbookfind.com and find **two books** that are on your level to read this summer. One should be fiction and one should be non-fiction. **You will take an AR quiz on your first week back to school on these books.**
- **Math:** Must come to school in September with multiplication and division facts (0-12) memorized.
