From the Vicar,

The month of March has two solemnities that fall during Lent: St. Joseph (March 19) and the Annunciation (March 25). Since March is the month of St. Joseph, I would like to focus on the former solemnity.

A long-held belief among many saints, popes, theologians and Doctors of the Church is that St. Joseph was cleansed of original sin while in the womb—i.e., before birth. He was not conceived immaculately, but was purified after conception and thus born without original sin. St. Alphonsus Liguori, who believed this, also held that St. Joseph never committed a personal sin. This is not doctrine nor dogma but a pious tradition. Another correlate to Joseph's lifelong sinlessness is that he was assumed bodily into Heaven. This was held by Pope St. John XXIII and eminent theologians and saints like St. Bernardine of Siena, St. Vincent Ferrer, St. Francis de Sales and Jean Gerson. That there are no relics of his body or claims to his tomb buttressed this idea.

Joseph is a quiet hero—a man's man. The Gospels say little about Joseph and Joseph says absolutely nothing in the Gospels. But the actions of this "master dreamer" (like Joseph of old) speak volumes. In his two roles as Jesus' earthly (foster) father and Mary's husband, he faithfully served God in the vocation Providence called him into.

Several Franciscans argued that although Joseph was not Jesus' biological father he served as his father in every other way. St. Bernardine of Siena said, "Joseph held Christ in his arms like a father and spoke baby talk ... [and] with sweetness heard the little babbling child call him 'father'!"

The Church has fully embraced St. Joseph who was often in the shadows of the two more eminent members of the Holy Family. In 1870 Pope Pius IX proclaimed him patron of the universal Church. He was the only saint who appeared at Fatima (1917) other than Our Lady. In 1955, May 1 was celebrated as the memorial of "Joseph the Worker" as an alternative to Communist May Day celebrations. In 1962 "Joseph" was added to Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I) by Pope St. John XXIII and was declared the patron of Vatican II (1962-1965) by the same pope. In 2013 Pope Francis added Joseph's name to Eucharistic Prayers II, III, and IV. So don't hesitate to ask St. Joseph to intercede for you for issues of family, employment, being a faithful and chaste Christian man, traveling, and protection from evil. "Go to Joseph!" (Genesis 41:55) the Bible says. Let's do—and not just in March. St. Teresa of Avila was right some 500 years ago: in the last days his star will shine!
