Miss N Scholarship

The *Miss N Scholarship* honors Anne Nettleton, a beloved artist and teacher. The scholarship recognizes a current graduating USD 305 senior who plans to major in art or art education.

Anne Nettleton taught elementary art in Salina USD 305 for 37 years from 1973 until her retirement in 2010. She was bursting with life and energy and deeply committed to art education and to children. She would blow into a classroom toting plenty of sparkly colorful supplies and creative ideas, and with just a little razzle-dazzle she was able to give children, as well as adults, permission to be joyful and expressive. Anne was foundational in developing and sustaining educational art programs in USD 305 and throughout the community. In the beginning, she was one of just a couple of elementary art teachers who traveled from school to school doing "art from a cart." It seemed wherever "Miss N" went in the community she was greeted enthusiastically by current and former students, parents, and friends eager to tell her about what they were doing. She always had her own interesting stories to share. Former students recount how they always felt special and unique in her eyes. Numerous students have been inspired by her example to pursue the arts or become teachers.

A committee consisting of one representative of Anne Nettleton's family, a USD 305 Art Teacher, and an artist from the community will select the recipient.

Upon notification of selection by the committee, the Salina Education Foundation will announce the recipient. Once selected, the recipient will provide the SEF with the name of the college or university he/she wishes to attend, and the \$500 check will be issued to the student/college or program. The scholarship recipient will be notified immediately following the selection process.

Eligibility

One \$500 scholarship may be awarded each calendar year on an objective and nondiscriminatory basis. All applicants must be planning to major in art education or visual arts from an accredited degree-granting institution.
