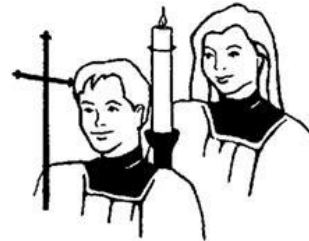

## The Pastor's Workshop

**Question of the week, "Father, why don't you announce who the Mass is for?"** This has been a rather constant inquiry since I have been ordained. I'm positive most priests are asked this numerous times. I'll try to explain my rationale. Some may disagree with me.....it's a free country as it's said. Some sites (parishes, shrines, etc.) over time have a custom of announcing who the intention is for. It's **never** been my own experience, nor would I say, most parishes or most priests. I come from the school (my boyhood home – 26 years, the seminary – 12 years, and **all** my past 9 parishes as pastor, associate, and deacon - 41 years) that the particular intention was **never** announced before or within the context of the Holy Eucharist. Again this isn't everywhere....you'll find priests that wish to do so. My own humble take on this is **theological**, and then simply, **fairness**. First it sounds, when announced to the congregation, that this particular Mass is only for that particular person, in reality – **the Mass is for all people, living and dead**. The meager stipend given towards the intention cannot purchase a Mass. As I understand it, it was customary to give this stipend to support priests to function, especially in poor countries. Secondly, regarding **fairness**, a lot of people are left out of the mix and never get mentioned.....while a small percentage of intentions, are celebrated over and over again. Some intentions are designated by funds left in wills, still others are presented for annual anniversaries by their descendants. **This is all well and good, (I actually do it for my parents)**, a kind and loving gesture to remember them. However there are many other individuals who have left no Masses, or even no survivors.....so what of them? When in doubt I try to follow the practice of the St. Louis Cathedral, the mother church of this Archdiocese. **The Cathedral Basilica does not announce, except in the bulletin, just as we do here**. As a priest, it's my habit to look at the particular intention posted on the board in the sacristy **before Mass** and quietly present it in my prayer at Mass, especially at the point of the deceased.... if I know the person has passed on. Of course, Masses can be offered for the living as well. I often tell people as I visit them in the hospital, that I will 'put them on the altar'. This is what we do when we have a Mass said. I hope this resolves any questions.
