TAKE NOTE ABOUT CREMATION

There is a newer cremation process called *alkaline hydrolysis*. This cremation process uses a chemical solution - instead of heat - to reduce the human body to liquid and bones. After the body has been 'bathed' in the chemical solution for a few hours, the process is completed leaving behind a sterile liquid and bone fragments. The liquid solution is disposed of through the sewer system while the bone fragments are then pulverized into ash and returned to the family.

Since this *alkaline hydrolysis* releases remnants of the human body into the sewer system, this form of cremation in its current practice violates the dignity of the deceased human person. The Archdiocese of St. Louis advises Catholics to avoid *alkaline hydrolysis* until another suitable means of disposing of the liquid remnant can be established.
