Saint John Paul II

Bishop Karol Jozef Wojtyla attended all four sessions of Vatican II and contributed especially to its *Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World*. Appointed as archbishop of Kraków in 1964, he was named a cardinal three years later. He was elected pope in October 1978. John Paul II promoted ecumenical and interfaith initiatives, especially the 1986 Day of Prayer for World Peace in Assisi.

In his 27 years of papal ministry, John Paul II wrote 14 encyclicals and five books, canonized 482 saints and beatified 1,338 people. In the last years of his life, he suffered from Parkinson's disease and was forced to cut back on some of his activities. Pope Benedict XVI beatified John Paul II in 2011, and Pope Francis canonized him in 2014.

World Mission Sunday

One Sunday for the Whole World. On this World Mission Sunday, Pope Francis calls all of us—children of God—to be “voices for mission.” Today we “speak up” through our prayers and personal sacrifices for our brothers and sisters in the Missions—in places like Uganda where people face food uncertainty and violence...in the Philippines where local clergy face martyrdom ...in Oceania where peoples' livelihoods are threatened by climate change...and in remote regions of Latin America where people are hearing the Gospel for the first time.
