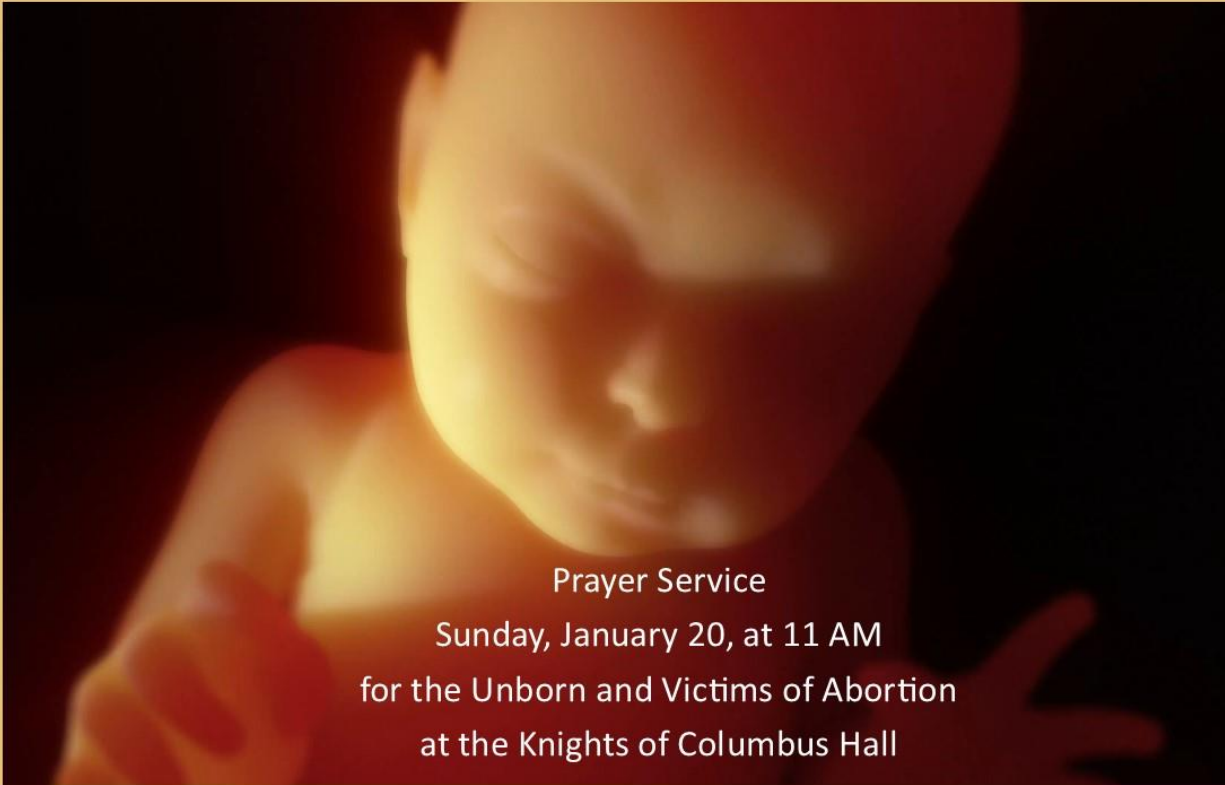

Annual Memorial Mass & Prayer Vigil

This January marks 46 years since the U.S. Supreme Court legalized abortion which has ended over 60 million unborn lives and harmed countless more women, men, and families. Please join the St. Louis Respect Life Community in praying for an end to abortion, healing and forgiveness for those involved in abortion, and an increased respect for all human life.

The Annual Roe v. Wade Memorial Mass will be held on Saturday, January 26 at 10 a.m. at the Cathedral Basilica. This special Mass features a Pro-Life Generation rose procession and a collection to benefit the LifeLine Coalition, a group of local Catholic and pro-life social service agencies who help more than 10,000 annually. Following Mass, a peaceful and prayerful Rosary Walk to and from Planned Parenthood will take place. The event concludes with Benediction back at the Cathedral.

St. Vincent of Saragossa

In 304 St. Vincent and his bishop, St. Valerius, were swept up in the persecution ordered by the emperor Diocletian, who required all subjects to worship the Roman gods. After being transferred to Valencia, they were imprisoned for a long time without food, though this failed to weaken their resolution. Though Valerius was merely banished, Vincent was subjected to every torture that the governor and his henchmen could devise—beginning with the rack, to then being ripped with iron hooks, and finally placed on a fiery gridiron. His jailer, observing that Vincent seemed to be bathed in light, was converted to Christianity. He allowed fellow Christians to enter the jail and wash his body; these blood-soaked rags were later venerated as relics. Vincent died quietly in his cell.
