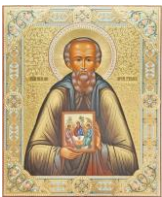
Craft/Sewing Fellowship

St. Andrei Rublev

The use of icons, highly spiritualized depictions of Christ, Mary, and the saints, was one of the earliest and most distinctive elements of Byzantine spirituality. The production of icons was itself a spiritual work, generally in the hands of monks, accompanied by intense prayer. St. Andrei Rublev, a Russian monk of the fifteenth century, is the most widely revered. His most famous work is his icon of the Holy Trinity, in which he used the image of the three mysterious angels who visited the tent of Abraham at the oak of Mamre. Seated around a table, set for a meal, the three angelic figures show the differentiation, and at the same time the identity and interrelationship, between the persons of the Trinity.

St. Blaise

Bishop Blaise was martyred in his episcopal city of Sebastea, Armenia, in 316. The legendary *Acts of St. Blaise* were written 400 years later. According to them Blaise was a good bishop, working hard to encourage the spiritual and physical health of his people. Although the Edict of Toleration (311), granting freedom of worship in the Roman Empire, was already five years old, persecution still raged in Armenia. Blaise was apparently forced to flee to the back country. There he lived as a hermit in solitude and prayer, but he made friends with the wild animals. One day a group of hunters seeking wild animals for the amphitheater stumbled upon Blaise's cave. The bishop was kneeling in prayer surrounded by patiently waiting wolves, lions and bears. The legend has it that as the hunters hauled Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command the child was able to cough up the bone.

We will have the *Blessing of the Throats* at all the Masses on Saturday, February 2nd and Sunday, February 3th at St. Joseph and St. Anne Parishes.
