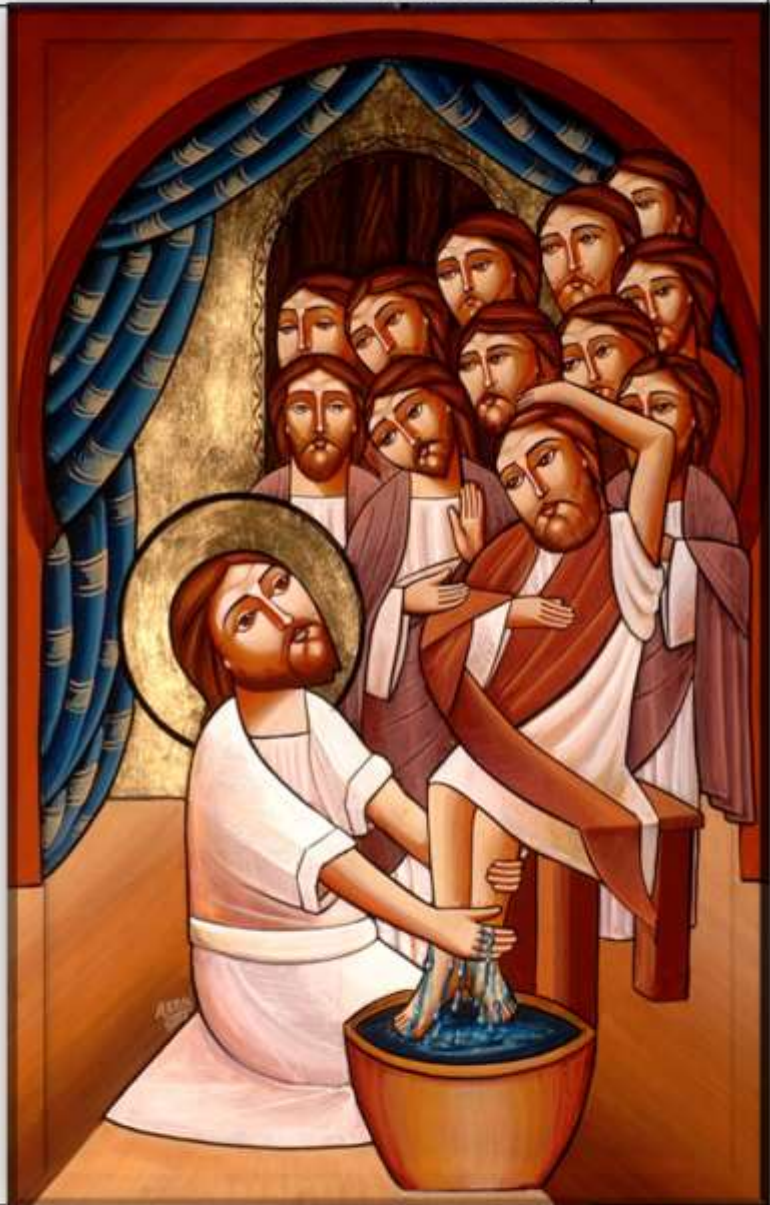

Journey Through Scripture

Beginning Tuesday, April 2, after Perpetual Help Devotions a program on the Sacraments will be offered. It will be held in the meeting room with a continental breakfast. The DVD program is approximately 30 minutes long with discussion to follow.

The Bible and the Sacraments: Journey Through Scripture
The St. Paul Center's dynamic Bible study programs are designed to help ordinary Catholics grow in their knowledge of Scripture while deepening their understanding of the riches of our faith. Distinctively Catholic, Journey Through Scripture reads the Bible from the heart of the Church, considering both the Old and New Testaments and how they work together. The series offered the next few weeks (four or five weeks) is “The Bible and the Sacraments”. This series examines the sacraments of the Catholic faith, exploring their meaning, where the sacraments come from, what they mean and why they are so foundational to our faith.

The Holy Triduum

The Paschal Triduum, Latin for “three days”, commemorates Christ's redemptive journey through death, burial and resurrection to new life. The Church observes the Triduum as a single event made up of three distinct parts. In accordance with the custom in biblical times, each “day” begins in the evening.

Holy Thursday

The first day of the Triduum is filled with the action of Christ's self-gift. The Mass of the Lord's Supper on the evening of Holy Thursday commemorates Christ's command that we “love one another.” Symbolized in the washing of the feet, the great commission of Christ is made concrete in the Eucharist as well as in Jesus' crucifixion on Calvary. The first day of the Paschal Triduum culminates in the solemn veneration of the cross on Good Friday.

Good Friday

The second day of the Triduum is filled with the silence of the tomb. The solemnity of Good Friday continues throughout the day of Holy Saturday. The Church celebrates no Eucharistic liturgy during the day, but silently prepares for the Easter Vigil celebration in the evening. As Jesus remained in the tomb, so the Church as a whole awaits the coming of the Lord's kingdom.

Easter Vigil

The third day of the Triduum is filled with the wonder of the resurrection. The Easter Vigil is the high point of the liturgical year. The drama of the lighting of the new fire, the blessing of the Paschal candle and the Easter proclamation in the candlelit church set the stage for the recounting of the story of salvation in the Scripture readings. “Alleluia” once again greets the Gospel, and following the homily, we celebrate baptism and the renewal of our baptismal promises. The Paschal Triduum officially concludes with evening prayer on Easter Sunday.
