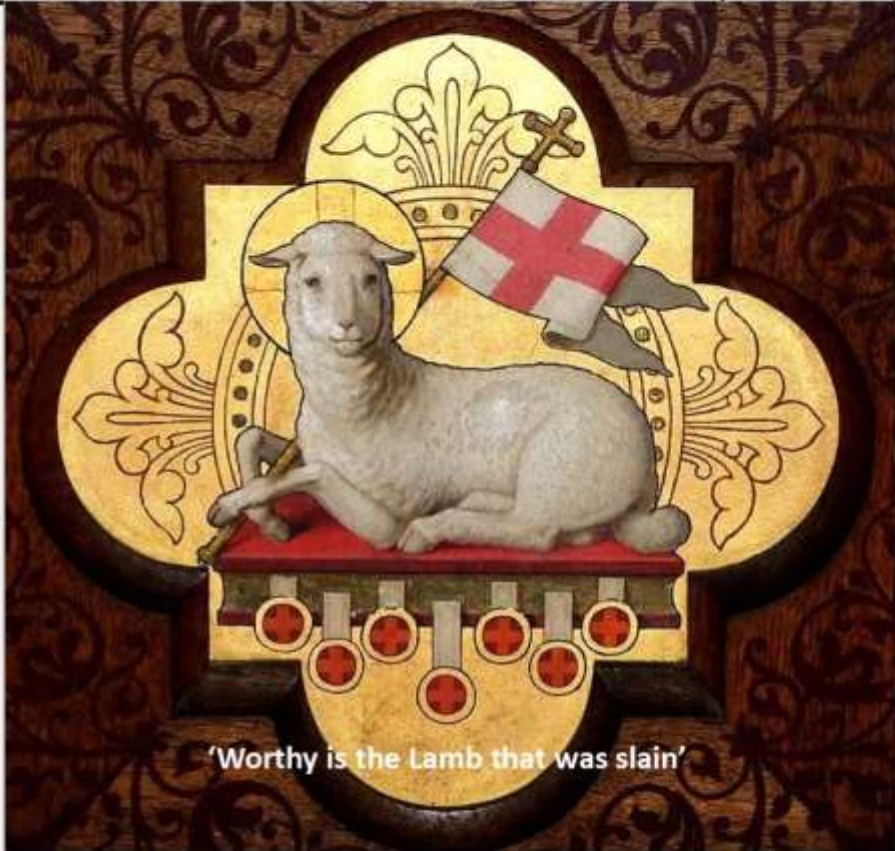

Blessed Theresa of Jesus

Caroline Gerhardinger was born in Stadtamhof, Germany, where she was educated by the Canonesses of Notre Dame. When the congregation was suppressed under Napoleon’s campaign of secularization, she resumed her studies under a local priest. All the while she dreamed, when conditions might allow, of founding her own order of teaching sisters. In 1833 Gerhardinger founded the School of Sisters of Notre Dame, taking the religious name Theresa of Jesus. Mother Theresa believed that true education had a deeply religious dimension. As she taught her sisters, “For us education means enabling persons to reach the fullness of their potential as individuals created in God’s image.” In 1847, after establishing many communities and schools in Germany, she sailed for America, where she established a second motherhouse in Baltimore with support from the German-speaking bishop John Neumann. Returning to Germany, she endured conflicts with Church leaders as well as the state. She died on May 9, 1879, and was beatified in 1985.
