The Most Holy Trinity

We all know that we can see evidence that the Blessed Trinity is present in many ways in our world. For instance, the Trinity is present in each person, in nature, and in all things. However, did you know that Scripture tells us that when we love God and are in a state of grace the Most Holy Trinity actually dwells within our souls? John 14:23 states, “Jesus said, If anyone loves me, he will keep my word. My Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him.” Many of the saints wrote about this truth in their works including St. Thomas Aquinas, St. Teresa of Avila, St. John of the Cross, etc. Today’s solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity reminds us of the Love, Joy, and Peace shared by the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This one God in three distinct persons is a communion of life and love. When we are in communion with the Most Holy Trinity, we can participate in that communion and we can experience God’s life and love. This week is a great opportunity for us to examine our consciences and celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation if needed. It is also a wonderful opportunity to pray in front of the Blessed Sacrament and ask Jesus to open our hearts and minds so that we can be aware of the Love, Joy, and Peace of the Most Blessed Trinity within our souls.

How to Pray with/for/over Someone

Thanksgiving is one of the highest forms of prayer that we can offer to God. When praying with someone, begin by giving thanks to God for the gift of that person, for the gift of faith, life, the gift of grace, etc. Even in the midst of trials, we always have something to be grateful for. A simple prayer might be: "Lord, I give you thanks for the gift of ____, for the gifts you have given her, the good that she reveals."

After giving thanks, **pray for the specific need** that the person needs at that moment. Not only the surface needs, but also the spiritual ones. For example, "I ask you help ____ at work tomorrow, but most of all that she trusts that you are with her to guard and guide her ..."

Finally, **give a prayer of blessing**. For example, "Lord, I ask you to bless ____, may she always know how loved she is, both by you and by her family." *Excerpted from Father Christopher Martin – St. Louis Catholic Magazine*
