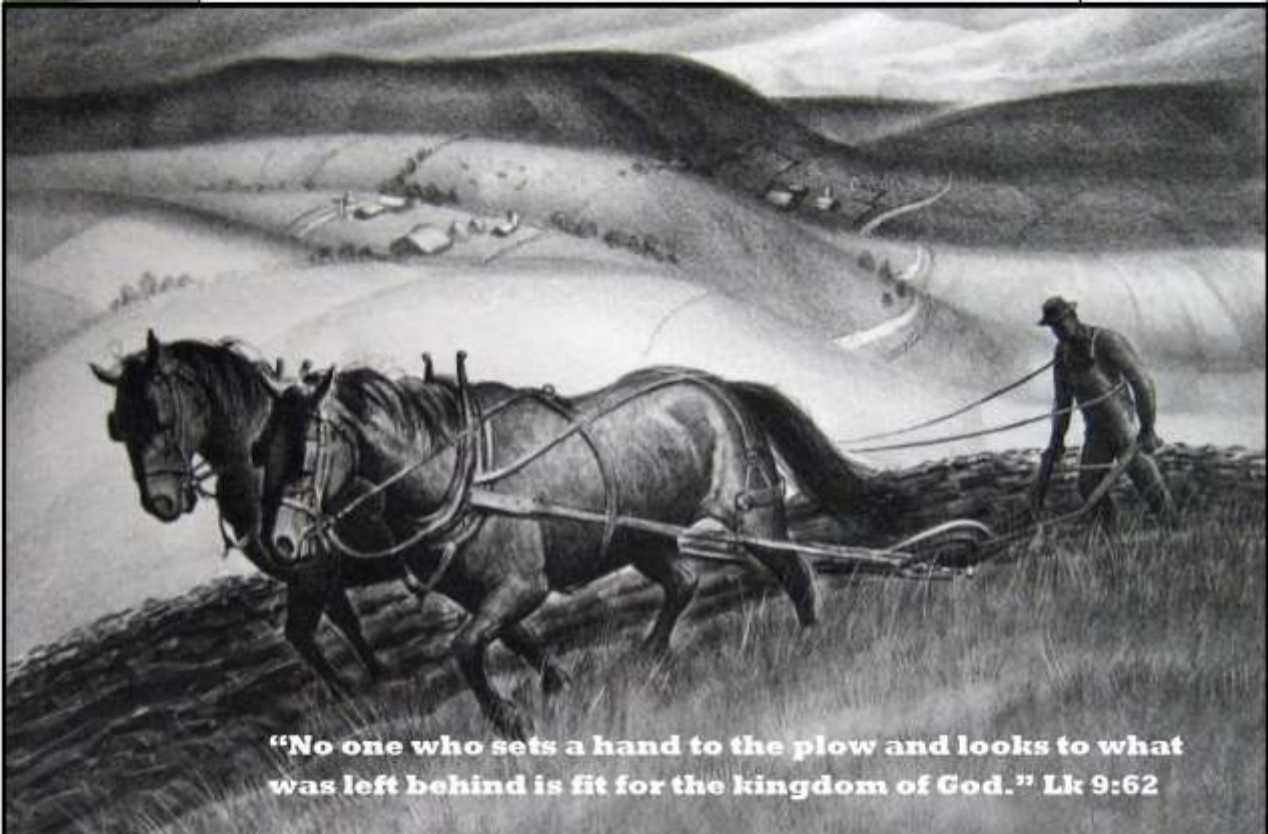

St. Oliver Plunkett

Born in County Meath in 1629, Oliver studied for the priesthood in Rome and was ordained there in 1654. After some years of teaching and service to the poor of Rome he was appointed Archbishop of Armagh in Ireland. Four years later, in 1673, a new wave of anti-Catholic persecution began, forcing Archbishop Plunkett to do his pastoral work in secrecy and disguise and to live in hiding. Meanwhile, many of his priests were sent into exile, schools were closed, Church services had to be held in secret, and convents and seminaries were suppressed. As archbishop, Plunkett was viewed as ultimately responsible for any rebellion or political activity among his parishioners. Archbishop Plunkett was arrested and imprisoned in Dublin Castle in 1679, but his trial was moved to London. After deliberating for 15 minutes, a jury found him guilty of fomenting revolt. He was hanged, drawn, and quartered in July 1681.

Pope Paul VI canonized Oliver Plunkett in 1975.

Dynamic Catholic, Alive! – True Freedom

Our culture teaches us that freedom is the ability to do anything we want. Companies even use slogans like “Be fearless, Be limitless” “Just do it” etc. Scripture teaches us that true freedom doesn’t mean we have the freedom to do anything we want, because that includes sin. Scripture tells us true freedom means being free from sin. Paul explains in today’s reading to the Galatians, “Brothers and sisters For freedom Christ set us free; so stand firm and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery.” Paul is clear in his message to us that some of our actions or decisions can actually take away our freedom. For instance, when someone hurts us in some way and we refuse to forgive them, we are slaves to our anger, frustration, and unforgiveness. Many of us find ourselves confessing the same sin over and over. Even though we receive absolution we can still be slaves to that sin. This week we can take some time to use a Bible Concordance to search for the word freedom and read the passages, so we can come to a better understanding of what true freedom really is. We could also take some time to pray and examine our consciences to discover if there is anything in our lives that is holding us back from achieving true freedom. www.archstl.org/live-the-faith
