Servant of God Rose Hawthorne

Rose Hawthorne was the third child of Nathaniel Hawthorne, the great American writer. The devastating loss of her father, when she was thirteen, compounded a few years later by the death of her mother, left her bereft. She accepted the proposal of the writer, George Lathrop, whom she married in 1871. In 1891 they were both received into the Catholic Church, yet two years later they formally separated. Finding herself alone in New York City, Rose felt called to some heroic expression of her faith. In becoming aware of the plight of impoverished cancer patients banished to die in isolation on Blackwell's Island, she found her calling. After obtaining a nursing degree, she began visiting and then inviting cancer patients to share her own apartment. In 1900 she and a companion were received into the Dominican Order. She died on July 9, 1926. Her cause for canonization is in process.

In the 2nd reading St. Paul said, "May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ." In order to be Missionary Disciples, we don't need to be scholars of the faith like St. Thomas Aquinas or St. Augustine! We just need to boast in the cross of Christ by sharing our own relationship with Jesus. Why do we need to do this? Jesus answered that question in the Gospel when He said, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few." This takes practice and it can be scary at first, but Jesus told His disciples if people don't listen to your message when you speak in My name then wipe the dust off your feet and move on. We shouldn't take it personally, because as Missionary Disciples we don't speak for ourselves, we are sharing the message Christ not only provided to us but the one He died to give. It would be good to take an opportunity this week to meditate on the what, when, where, and how of our story as a friend of Christ. Once we do that, it will be much easier to share that story with others.
