



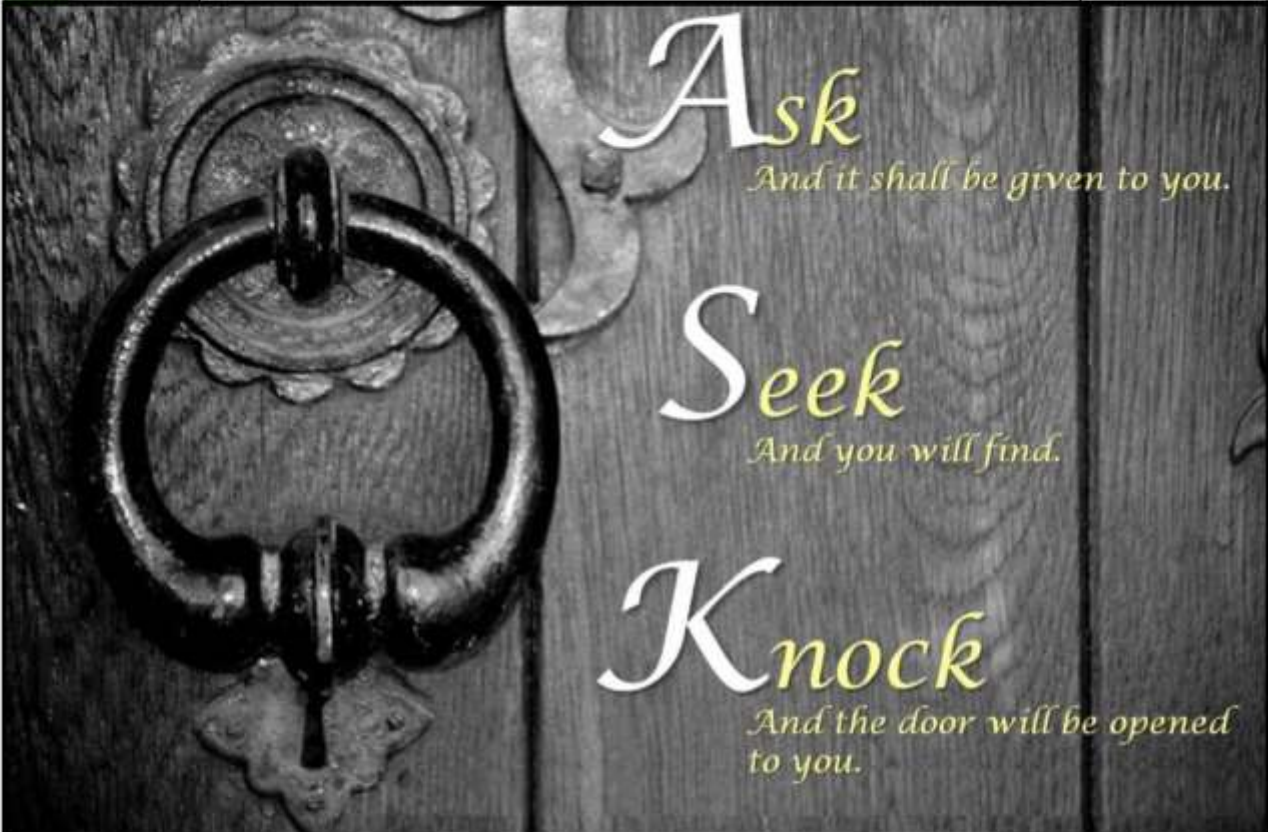

## Dynamic Catholic, *Alive!*

In the first reading today, Abraham negotiated with God, because he wanted to make sure that God was merciful with any innocent people left in Sodom and Gomorrah. Sometimes we can easily fall into the trap of negotiating with God. We can be like children negotiating with a parent. That is probably why Jesus felt the need to teach his disciples how to pray in today's Gospel. In addition, in the Gospel, Jesus stressed to His friends, "And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; Now we all have learned that God always answers our prayer, but the answers are often surprising to us, because they don't match our expectations. Why is this? God has more information about our lives than we do. The other reason is that He knows each of us better than we know ourselves. ## Saint Alphonsus Liguori's Story



Alphonsus received a doctorate in both canon and civil law by acclamation, at the age of 16, at the University of Naples, but he soon gave up the practice of law for apostolic activity. He was ordained a priest, and concentrated his pastoral efforts on popular parish missions, hearing confessions, and forming Christian groups. He founded the Redemptorist congregation in 1732. It was an association of priests and brothers living a common life, dedicated to the imitation of Christ, and working mainly in popular missions for peasants in rural areas. Alphonsus' great pastoral reforms were in the pulpit and confessional—replacing the pompous oratory of the time with simplicity, and the rigorism of Jansenism with kindness. He was made bishop at age 66 after trying to reject the honor, and at once instituted a thorough reform of his diocese. Alphonsus is best known for his moral theology, but he also wrote well in the field of spiritual and dogmatic theology.

His *Glories of Mary* is one of the great works on that subject, and his book *Visits to the Blessed Sacrament* went through 40 editions in his lifetime, greatly influencing the practice of this devotion in the Church. [www.franciscanmedia.org](http://www.franciscanmedia.org)
