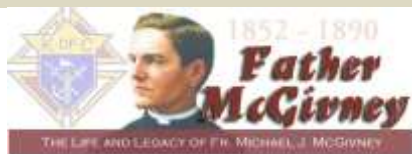

Michael McGivney, the son of Irish immigrants, was born in Connecticut to a family of thirteen children. At the age of sixteen he left for the seminary. Ordained in 1877, he was assigned to St. Mary's Church in New Haven. It was a time of severe anti-Catholic prejudice. Most of his parishioners were poor working people, many of them immigrants. From his own family life he was aware of their struggles – particularly the hardship caused by the death of a breadwinner. McGivney conceived of the idea of a Catholic fraternal society to help strengthen faith and provide financial support to families in need. From this idea sprang the Knights of Columbus, founded in 1882. With support from the bishops, McGivney spread word of the Knights throughout Connecticut and elsewhere. It quickly took off, though Fr. McGivney's service as chaplain to the Knights did not last long. He contracted pneumonia and died on August 14, 1890, at the age of thirty-eight. Today the Knights of Columbus, with almost two million member families, is the world's largest Catholic fraternal service organization. Fr. McGivney's heroic virtues were recognized by Pope Benedict XVI in 2008, and he was declared venerable. *Give Us This Day*

Teach Us to Pray Talking to God as a Friend

In one section of the *Spiritual Exercises*, his classic manual on prayer, St. Ignatius Loyola encourages us to speak to God “as one friend speaks to another.” But St. Ignatius didn't invent this beautiful way of interacting with God. After all, as we know from the book of Exodus: “The Lord used to speak to Moses face to face, as one speaks to a friend” (33:11). St. Ignatius calls this way of praying a “colloquy” or, more commonly, a conversation. He encourages believers to do this with God the Father, with Jesus, and also with Mary. Many people find this an entirely natural way to pray. They say, “How else would I speak to God other than in conversation?” Others find it odd – almost offensive. They can't imagine speaking to the Creator of the universe as a “friend.” But you can have reverence for someone and consider them a friend at the same time. Imagine yourself addressing a wise and elderly mentor you've known your entire life. You would likely be both reverent and friendly.

A “colloquy” doesn't have to be complicated. Simply imagine yourself in the presence of God (or Jesus or Mary) in some way (for example, sitting in a chair beside you) and open yourself to them. And, if you are able, imagine what they might have to say to you. And always remember, as the Jesuit William A. Barry often points out, God desires your friendship.
