St. Pius X

The papal election of Cardinal Giuseppe Sarto, Patriarch of Venice, followed the death in 1903 of the long-reigning Pope Leo XIII, who had renewed the Church's engagement with the modern world. In his encyclical *Rerum Novarum*, Leo laid the foundations for Catholic social teaching, and he had offered tentative support to the science of modern biblical criticism.

In taking the name Pius X, Sarto indicated a desire to invoke the spirit of the previous pope, Pius IX (1846-1878), who had battled theological liberalism and defended papal authority. Sarto had risen in the Church from humble origins; his father was a postal clerk in Lombardy. He retained an instinct for the "simple faithful" and promoted devotion to the Blessed Mother and frequent communion. He also sponsored the codification of canon law and decreed that the theology of Thomas Aquinas should form the curriculum of seminary education. Pius X died on August 20, 1914. He was canonized in 1954 by Pope Pius XII.
