Venerable Pauline Jaricot

Though born to a wealthy family in France, Pauline Jaricot felt called from an early age to give everything for the cause of Christ. She was adept at translating her pious impulses into successful organizations, as when at nineteen she formed the girls working in her father’s factory into a network of prayer. The next year she organized the Society for the Propagation of the Faith to support overseas missions through prayer and fundraising. Her third great project was a “Living Rosary,” a network of groups of fifteen persons, each of them assigned to pray a single mystery of the rosary for an entire month. Despite her accomplishments, Pauline was beset by detractors and other setbacks. The last years of her life were spent in poverty, as she struggled to repay debts incurred by a swindler. She died a pauper on January 9, 1862. Her cause for canonization is in progress.
