ADVENT

Advent comes from the Latin word meaning "coming." Jesus is coming! Advent is intended to be a season of preparation for His arrival. While we typically regard Advent as a joyous season, it is also intended to be a period of preparation, much like Lent. Prayer, penance, and fasting are appropriate during this season. Advent is also the first season of the liturgical year in the Catholic Church. It always begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day, which is also the Sunday closest to November 30, and ends on Christmas Eve.

Once again this year, our Pastorate has purchased a limited number of copies of a daily reflection booklet. This year the booklet, "Waiting In The Light" by author Steve Givens, provides an inspiring prayer, accompanied by Scripture, for each day of the season. Being attentive to prayer and God's Word allows us to see the light shining through the darkness. Through prayer and reflection, we see Jesus, the Light of the World, this Christmas. These booklets will be available in the back of each of our churches over the next few weekends until they are gone.

For online Advent opportunities, Formed will be offering their daily Advent reflections. Sign up by going to Formed.org. You can also sign up for daily email reflections from Dynamic Catholic with their Best Advent Ever series. This year's theme is "Amazing Possibilities". To sign up, go to dynamiccatholic.com/best-advent-ever.

Everyone is encouraged to take time to slow down during the busyness of this season to focus more on the true reason of the season. Doing one or more of the options above are something you can do. Maybe you could help with our annual Christmas Basket distribution by making something to put in them, putting them together, and/or helping to deliver them. Maybe you could pray a Rosary more often during the weeks of Advent or stop by a church to sit in silence for several minutes to pray or just to sit still for that time. Maybe you could do an act of kindness each day for someone without them knowing or be more mindful of what you are grateful for each day. Consider having an Advent wreath in your home to light the candle each week and focus on the meaning of those candles as you get closer to Christmas Day. There are countless ways to enhance your Advent experience that will help you welcome Jesus more fully on Christmas Day...what will you do?

This year, the first Sunday of Advent is December 1st.

Keeping Families Together Bulletin Series

Catholic Charities' Immigration Legal Services will be sharing a series of articles and facts related to immigrants through November and December to educate and raise awareness on significant issues related to our immigrant brothers and sisters.

Facts, not Myths, About Immigrants

FACT: Immigrants in all ethnic categories commit LESS crime than native-born Americans.

Immigrants have the lowest crime rates of any other demographic group in the U.S. In California, male Mexican nationals ages 18 to 40 -- those more likely to have entered the country illegally -- are more than eight times less likely than their U.S.-born counterparts to be imprisoned. According to a 2008 report from the conservative Americas Majority Foundation18, crime rates are lowest in states with the highest immigration growth rates. From 1999 to 2006, the total crime rate declined 13.6 percent in the 19 highest-immigration states, compared to a 7.1 percent decline in the other 32 states.
