Divine Mercy Sunday, April 11, 2021

From Fr. Mark

Today is the Octave Day of Easter, the Second Sunday of the Easter season, and is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. In the year 2000, Pope John Paul II established this Sunday as Divine Mercy Sunday, as he was very devoted to Sr. Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun who received visions of the resurrected Christ in the 1930's.

A painting was done of Jesus as described by Sr. Faustina from her vision. From the lance wound in his side issued forth two rays of light, one clear, and one red. This calls to mind the passage from the Gospel of John, that after the soldier pierced Jesus' side with a lance, immediately there flowed out blood and water. The Church has understood this to represent the sacraments of Baptism and Eucharist. In her vision, Sr. Faustina was instructed by Jesus to tell others to pray the Divine mercy Chaplet. She also prayed repeatedly, "Jesus, I trust in you!"

Pope John Paul II canonized Sr. Faustina as St. Faustina in 2000, making her the "first saint of the new millennium". Speaking of Sr. Faustina and the importance of the message contained in her Diary, the Pope called her "the great apostle of Divine mercy in our time". Today we continue to rely on the experience of Sr. Faustina as a constant reminder to "trust in Jesus' endless mercy" and to offer mercy to others. We also ask her to intercede to our merciful Savior on our behalf. We pray for our students who are receiving their First Communion on Saturday and Sunday. Since the scarlet ray emanating from the heart of Jesus in St. Faustina's vision represents the Eucharist, this is a very appropriate Sunday to celebrate First Communion! We also pray that the Divine Mercy of Jesus can lead to the end of the covid 19 pandemic.

And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.
